Raile reunion held over the weekend

From Oregon to Arkansas, grandchildren of Gottlieb and Regina Raile arrived in St. Francis

to participate in the Raile Cousin Reunion the weekend of June 20-21. Gottlieb and Regina, both born in

Russia in the late 1800s, immigrated to the United States as children with their parents. In 1904, the two married and homesteaded northwest of St. Francis. They had 10 children: Sophia, Elsie, Margaret, Emma, Arlene, Ernest, Lucile, Esther, Raymond and Dorine.

From those 10 children, 30 grandchildren were born all whose roots are still firmly planted in St. Francis. One grandchild, Carol Krien died as a small child and Ruth Goodale Bracelin died in 1994. Of the 28 remaining cousins, 22 were able to attend the reunion along with their families.

The reunion started with a reception and dinner at the senior citizen center. The noise level greatly increased with each new cousin arrival. Even though nametags were worn, most everyone readily recognized each other even though some had not seen each other for many decades.

Special guests of honor included Anna Raile Paraseah, Lakewood, Colo., Fred Krien, Fleda Raile and Dorine and Raymond Zimbleman of St. Francis. Lucile Neitzel, resident of the Good Samaritan Village was also recognized even though she was unable to attend.

Following the dinner, several hours were spent sharing stories from the past. One would think after listening to everyone that the family spent most of their time growing up at potluck dinners. The German-Russian aunts, who made the best kashkephla (cheese buttons), cabbage rolls and egg-noodles found reasons to bring the extended family together often. Every family gathering brought the cousins closer together.

The next morning the reunion group met at the Windmill Restaurant for a buffet breakfast. Following the meal, a caravan of vehicles traveled to the homestead of Gottlieb and Christina Raile (parents of Gottlieb Jr.) to tour the remaining buildings of the home site that dates back to 1887. The deteriorated rock and mud buildings that once were home to a family with 15 children brought many questions from members of the younger generations. "How could

such a large family live in such a small house?" "What is an ice house?" "Why are the walls so thick?"

The caravan then proceeded to the Gottlieb Jr. and Regina Raile farm now operated by Tim and Robyn Raile. Various family members took turns driving the restored John Deere tractor purchased new by Gottlieb Jr. in 1936. They also toured the barn, blacksmith shop and chicken coop built by Gottlieb and Regina. Before leaving, everyone gathered for a group picture in front of the large red barn built in 1923.

One last meal was shared at noon at the Diamond R Pool Hall, once operated by the Raile cousins' great uncle and aunt, Pete and Martha (Raile) Reichart.

The reunion created many new memories and strengthened old family ties. New generations met second and third cousins for the first time and learned about their unique family history.

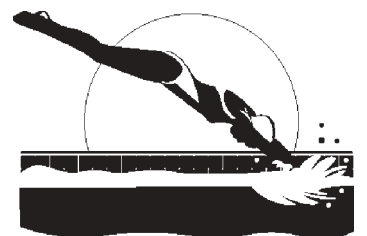
