# **Runner places in** benefit marathon

The 10th annual Kunitake Farms Kona Marathon in Kiauhou-Kona, Hawaii, had 2,200 participants on June 22. The course of the racer follows the run portion of the Ironman Triathlon. One of those participants was Shalom Kellner, D.C.

Dr. Kellner trained with the Kansas City Chapter of the Train to End Stroke (TTES) program. There were 59 individuals from Kansas City alone who, in addition to training for the marathon, also each raised at least \$4,900 to benefit the American Stroke Association, a branch of the American Heart Association. All proceeds are used for education, research and prevention of stroke and its many causes. Nationwide the program touted 1,400 participants in the Kona Marathon. Dr. Kellner ran in honor of Hertha Kelley, a family friend from St. Francis, who suffered a stroke April 14 as well as about 25 other stroke victims. She finished with a time of 4:47.43, placing 30th of 180 in her age group and 253rd overall.

"It was a really rewarding experience," Dr. Kellner said. "Through plishment I feel is incredible."
