Farm program now permits grazing

"Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) acreage is now eligible to be hayed or grazed as a required management practice." stated Angie Berens, Director of the Cheyenne County Farm Service Agency Office. "New provisions now allow managed haying or grazing on acreage no more than once every three years, starting this year. Producers must request authority to do this, comply wiht a haying or grazing plan through NRCS, and pay a fee equal to 25% of the annual rental rate on the acreage used", stated Berens. Under the new managed having and grazing, haying can be done from July 15 through Auguast 15 and grazing can be done beginning July 15 through approximately Sept., 30. Interested participants must contact the FSA office at (785) 332-2183 for policies, limitations and necessary signatures before beginning any haying or grazing practice. United State Department of Agriculture has developed a website for producers to list information concerning the need for available hay. The website address is http:// /www.fsa.usda.gov/haynet.


