The quilt blocks depict a Bible story and there are 12 stories from the Old Testament and 12 from the New Testament. Mrs. Peter embroidered each block and as she did so, she vividly remembered the story and, now each of her granddaughters and their families will also have the privilege to remember the Bible stories, as her two granddaughters Peggy Meyer and Debbie Mayfield have been given the quilts.

The New Testament quilt is unique as six of the blocks are bordered with a gold material to form a cross. One quilt will fit a double bed and the other, a queen-sized bed.

Mrs. Peter, who is 91 years old, spent most of two winters making the quilts but said she loved every minute of it.

"Handwork is almost a lost art and I enjoyed doing it, especially in the evenings when the television was on," she said. "I just felt like sitting in front of the television with nothing to do with my hands was a waste of time."

At 91 years, she says she is thankful that she can still thread a needle and she still uses the small embroidery needle. However, she said the quality of embroidery thread today is not good. — that it takes three strands of thread to equal the quality of two strands used years ago.

Through the years, she has embroidered 14 quilt tops, many table cloths and hundreds of tea towels, most of which she has given away.

The quilt showing brought many of Mrs. Peter's family members together for the day and when they weren't looking at the quilts, they were looking at family photos and visiting.
