The ladies have played hard this year and ended the season with a winning record (14-11). "In the match with Scott City, we played very competitively," Coach Talley Morrow said. "We effectively used Megan Rice on the front line and many of her attacks were unreturnable. Personal and team improvement have been tremendous and this crew is only going to get better in the seasons to come. You won't want to miss it."
