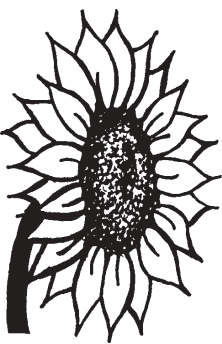

Saintry Indians win over Quinter Bulldogs

It was a solid offensive and defensive performance Friday as the St. Francis Indians dominated the football game against the Quinter Bulldogs. The final score was St. Francis 51, Quinter 8. St. Francis now stands with a 4-2 record. They will now enter District play with Oberlin this Friday, followed by Hoxie and Atwood.

Offensively, Derek Ross rushed for 133 yards and added two touchdowns and Kyle Buffington rushed for 82 yards. Seven other Indians contributed

to the rushing records including the younger players who ended the game after the Indians collected a strong lead. Freshman Joel McAtee joined the older Indians in adding a touchdown.

Defensively, Saintry held Quinter to 93 yards.

In the first play of the game, Jonathan Roelfs received the ball and ran 69 yards for a touchdown. Tyler Voorhies threw a pass to Michael Raile for the extra points and the score was 8 to 0.

The Bulldogs turned the play around and on their first possession of the ball, drove a 79 yard touchdown and passed for the extra two points, tying the score 8-8.

Saintry's second touchdown came when Roelfs ran a 13-yard touchdown and Voorhies carried in the two extra points. The first quarter ended with the Indians having 16 points on the score board, Quinter had 8.

Derek Ross earned the third touchdown when he carried the ball into the end zone on a 15-yard run. The extra point fell short.

Voorhies made a 9-yard run for the fourth touchdown for the Indians and also carried in the ball for two more points. The

Indians went to the locker rooms at halftime with the score showing 30 to 8.

Roelfs returned the opening kickoff with a 90 yard run, bring in six more points for the Indians. There were no extra points but the score was now 38-8.

More and more of the young Indian team were seeing action by the third quarter. Ross made a 6-yard run and was also in for two conversion points. The score was now 42-8.

By the fourth quarter, almost all of the team was made up of the younger Indians and, with only 8 minutes left on the clock, Joel McAtee carried in the ball for the seventh and last touchdown for the evening. A.J. McAtee passed the ball to Joel for the extra points and the game ended 51-8.

Lady Indians now moving into league, sub-state play

The volleyball season is winding down. The Lady Indians are moving into league and sub-state tournament action. On Tuesday they matched up with Oakley and Triplains in St. Francis and fell 25-23, 20-25, 9-15 to Oakley and 22-25, 19-25 to Triplains.

The Ladies played Sharon Springs and Triplains on Tuesday with results in the Oct. 23 issue of the Herald. This ended the regular season and now the tournaments begin.

"The Northwest Kansas League Tournament features many good teams," Coach Kent Kechter said. "It looks as if we will be the number eight seed and thus will be playing our matches on Saturday in the Oakley High School gym beginning at 10 a.m. Please support the Lady Indians.

"We are showing continual improvement in many areas. We must continue to stay positive and work hard to improve. These girls are so close to winning matches they can 'taste it.' (We have lost 10 games this season by three points or less and 15 games by five points or less.) We just need to make the one or two more good plays and the matches will be ours."

vs Oakley

"We played a very good match against Oakley," Coach Kechter said. "Statistically we performed well in all areas except setting ac-

curacy. This was one of the better matches of the season.

"I was pleased with the girls' effort and hustle. Losing was very disappointing because we could just as easily have won the match. We just need to make a couple more good plays a game to turn defeats into victories."

The team was 94.7 percent on their serves with Lori Faulkender having the most attempts, 10 (nine successful) and three players being 100 percent: Toni Rice was 7-of-7, Ashley Holzwarth was 6-of-6 and Amber Havel 6-of-6. Rice had the only ace. Service points went to Faulkender 6, Holzwarth 3, Kandee Raile 3, Rice 3, Havel 2 and Allyse Lampe 1.

On the hitting attack, Holzwarth handled 23 attempts with 19 being good. Having the best percentage (10 or more attempts) was Meredith Knodel with 12-of-13

Having kills were Holzwarth 7, Raile 5, Knodel 4, Rice 2 and Faulkender 1.

Havel handled 31 sets with 93.5 percent being successful. Rice was 28-of-28.

Holzwarth had 27 passes (21 good) and Raile 25 (21 good).

The team had 13 blocks, six stuffs and 23 digs/saves. Leading the way was Holzwarth with six blocks and three stuffs and Havel with six digs/saves.

vs Triplains

"We played so-so in the Triplains match," Coach Kechter said. "At times we looked like we were going to take the match, and at times like we were afraid to make a mistake and thus was not aggressive enough. We are still working on understanding how to be aggressive but safe when the game situations demand we are.

"Sometimes we play recklessly and sometimes we play too carefully. We must find the middle ground."

The serving percentage was lower than usual with a 85.7 team percentage. Rice and Talisa Voorhies each had one kill and scoring service points were Voorhies 6, Rice 5, Havel 3, Lampe 1, Raile 1.

The team was 83.1 percent on the hitting attack with 18 kills. Having kills were Holzwarth 4, Knodel 4, Raile 3, Faulkender 2, Rice 2, Ally Reichert 2, Voorhies 1.

Rice was successful on 30-of-38 sets to lead the team. Havel was 19-of-22.

The team had 133 passes with 78 on target and 27 playable for a total of 105 good passes.
