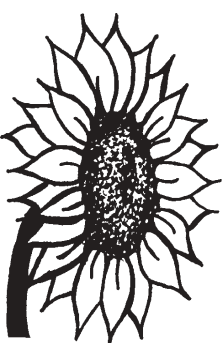


At the Game



League matches played

The Lady Indian volleyball team has finished the regular season with the final event being the Northwest Kansas League Tournament held on Saturday in Oakley. St. Francis was in a pool with Goodland, Quinter and Atwood and found the competition strong. They suffered match defeats against all three opponents, although they took Quinter to three games before the Lady Bulldogs pulled out the win.

Practices session now will involve preparing for the sub-state action to take place Saturday in WaKeeney (See related story).

The Ladies also played Sharon Springs and Triplains during the week. These games took place at Sharon Springs on Tuesday, Oct. 14, with the St. Francis team coming home with two losses.

Sharon Springs/Triplains

"We played well at Sharon Springs," Coach Kent Kechter said. "Unfortunately we had some injuries with Amber Havel having a broken foot and Meredith Knodel a sprained ankle."

Sharon Springs

In the first contest in Sharon Springs, the St. Francis Ladies met the Lady Wildcats. Saintry lost the match 25-29, 18-25, 9-15.

The Lady Indians were 92.5 percent serving in this contest. Kande Raile was 12-of-12 to lead the way with two other players, Talisa Voorhies and Allyse Lampe, both 2-of-2, also being 100 percent. Having aces were Lori Faulkender 2, Raile 2 and Amber Havel 1.

On the hitting attack, Holzwarth and Knodel handled the most attempts with Holzwarth being 16-of-16 and Knodel 15-of-16.

Havel had 26 setting attempts with Rice having 19. The team was 94 percent successful on their sets.

The Lady Indians were 93 percent on their serves, 77.8 percent hitting,

84.44 percent setting, and 41.41 percent passing. Triplains won 22-25, 19-25.

Leading the serving was Faulkender with 11-of-11 while Faulkender and Raile each had two aces and Holzwarth and Voorhies, one apiece.

Raile had 14 hitting attempts and was successful 10 times. Having the best percentages were Voorhies (5/5) and Amy Grace (2/2), who both were 100 percent.

The team had 99 passing attempts, with Raile being 20-of-25 and Holzwarth 19-of-22.

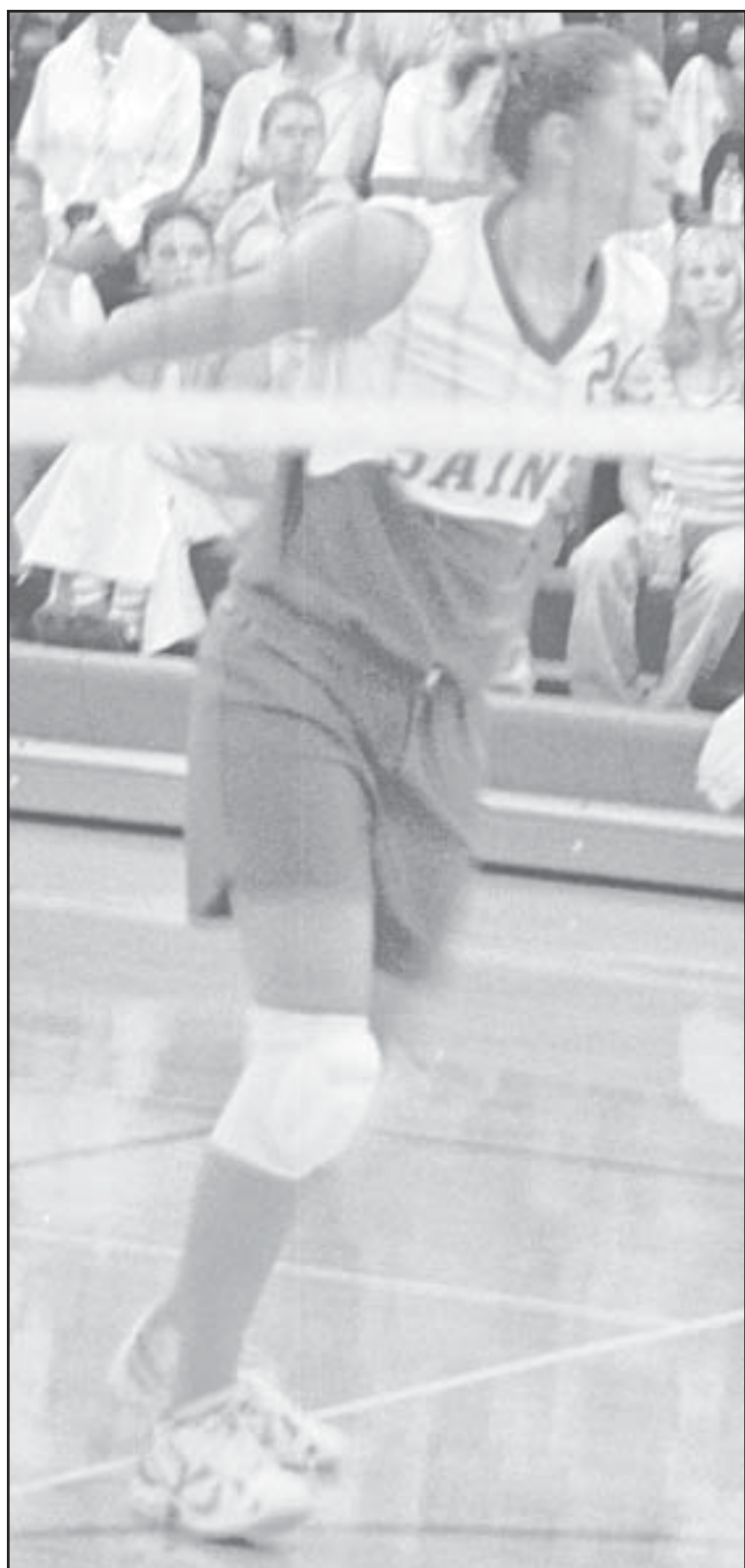

scores were 12-25, 16-25.

"The first game against Goodland was kind of sluggish at times by both teams," Coach Kechter said. "We hustled hard, but did not pass well enough to generate much of an offensive attack."

"In the second game we played better. We led 12-9 but then Goodland's powerful offensive attack went on a roll. They have some outstanding players."

The team was 93.1 percent from the serving line with four players being 100 percent: Faulkender 4/4, Holzwarth 4/4, Raile 3/3, Rice 2/2. Havel was 10-of-11 and she handled the most attempts. Having an ace was Holzwarth.

The team was 75.9 percent on the hitting attack.

St. Francis took Quinter to three games by winning the first game of the match. Quinter prevailed 25-22, 12-25, 10-15.

"We played well against Quinter," Coach Kechter said. "We won the first game in a close battle. In the second game we played well, but then Quinter went on a nine-point run late in the game. The third game was close, we just came up a little short."

Rice led the serving with 13-of-13 for 100 percent. The team was 95.7 percent. Voorhies had three

aces and Holzwarth had two.
