This was a major accomplishment which resulted in the Indians being named District 14 champions. They then moved forward and became Bi-District champions and Regional champions. By the time they met Claflin in Sectional competition their win-loss record had moved to 9-2.

Unfortunately Claflin again dashed the Indians hope of moving on to Sub-state and State.

"It was a fun year, fun to see really high expectations when the season began, to have the possibly of a failing year, to rebounding to the point where we had the opportunity to do things that have never been done here before (go to State)," Coach Tim Lambert said.
