Don't treat swallowed poison with syrup of ipecac

The ingestion of a potentially poisonous substance by a young child is a common event.

The Association of Poison Control Centers reported 1.2 million such events in children younger than 6 years in 2001. It is also important to note that poisoning deaths have dropped dramatically over the last 50 years and that most emergency rooms have stopped using the syrup of ipecac in favor of the more effective activation char-

induce vomiting after the ingestion of a potentially poisonous substance, it was never proven to be effective in preventing poisoning. Recent research has failed to show benefit for children who were treated with ipecac.

This is the key reason for this policy change. Prevention is the best defense against unintentional poisoning and that parents should keep potential poisons locked out of sight and out of reach.




