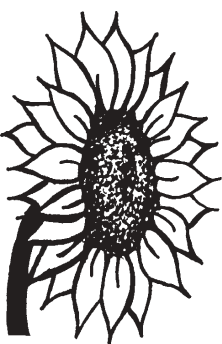


# At the Game

## January basketball action commences

The tough defense and explosive offense of Colby proved successful for the Eagles Saturday evening when they overcame the Indian boys basketball team 75-30 in Colby.

The Eagles took the lead early in the game and had the St. Francis team down 31-4 by the end of the first quarter.

"We played a very good, sound basketball team," Coach Ted Busse said.

The Eagles had a strong 55.4 percent from the field making 31 shots of the 56 they attempted. St. Francis had a problem coming up with offensive opportunities, making 11-of-28 shots.

Having over 50 percent from the field was Michael Raile with 5-of-7 for 71.4 percent. He was good from the free-throw line with 4-of-4. Tanner Kinen hit four shots from two-point range with three of them in the second quarter. Raile ended up with 14 points and Kinen collected 10.

Nick Raile attempted the only three-point shots for the home team and was 50 percent, making one of two.

Sainty had their best scoring opportunity during the third period when they collected 15 points. M. Raile had eight of these points.

Defensively Colby had 29 rebounds compared to 20 for St. Francis.

"We gave up way too many offensive rebounds," Coach Busse

said. Colby had 14 offensive boards to seven for Sainty.

Collecting the most rebounds for the Indians was M. Raile with six.

Sainty had three assists and five steals.

One area that proved to be successful for the Sainty Ladies was shooting from beyond the arc. They connected on the only three treys they attempted earning three-points each for Toni Rice, Ashley Holzwarth and Kandee Raile.

Amy Grace had the best percentage from two-point range with 3-for-3 for 100 percent.

Raile was the scoring leader for Sainty with 13 points. Besides her 1-of-1 from long range, she was 5-of-10 from two-point range.

With 11 opportunities from the line, the Ladies managed to score one point and that was by Hannah Sowers.

Defensively Sainty pulled down

20 free throws which was just a few behind the 23 Colby had. Raile had seven and Meredith Knodel was successful with six.

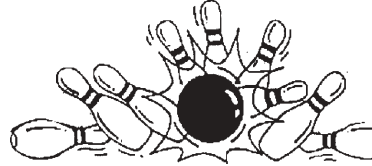
