Extension Board announces new director for the county

After almost five months, Cheyenne County has a new Extension director.

Tye Faulkender started duties on Jan. 19 and is careful to point out that he is not an "agent." Since he is the only agent in the county, his title is "director."

Mr. Faulkender was born and raised in Cheyenne County and lives on the family farm southwest of St. Francis. He graduated from Kansas State University in December 1994, with a degree in animal science. Since graduation, he worked at the St. Francis Equity, Cheyenne County Feed Yard and did some farming.

He will be spending the next month working and training with other agents in the area but will still find

time to work in the county office.

He is anxious to let people know what the extension service has to offer the county, its businesses, farmers and individuals. He plans to make farm and business visits and wants to build 4-H membership and interest.

"I want kids to know that 4-H can be and is 'fun,'" he said.

Among his duties as a director will be planning educational activities and coordinating programs. He encourages visits and calls with problems concerning agriculture, gardens, trees, bugs — anything that deals within the extension service.

"I will not know all the answers but I have good resources and, while it may sometimes take a little time, I will get those answers," Mr. Faulkender said.

"We are excited to have Tye with us," Perry Keller, chairman of the Extension Board, said. "He has all the qualifications to be an agent, has ties and is well known in the county."

"He has a strong background in 4-H, livestock and judging. He also worked with spraying and fertilizing at the co-op — he just has a well-rounded background."

Mr. Faulkender and his wife Amber have two sons, Jude, who is 6, and Jake, who is 3.

An open house is planned in the near future. In the meantime, Mr. Keller and the rest of the board are urging people to stop by the office in the southeast corner of the courthouse basement and visit with the new director and Stephanie Schafer, office professional.

Donors give over limit

The American Red Cross blood drive, held Jan. 15 in St. Francis, had 130 donors, 30 pints over the 100 goal set by the American Red Cross.

Ruth Moore, who chaired the drive which was hosted by the local Rebekah Lodge, reported there were 22 people who donated blood for the first time.

"The response we have each time we hold a blood drive is great!" she

said.

The American Red Cross was calling for all eligible blood donors but noted that types O-negative and O-positive were especially needed. A blood drive is generally held twice a year and donors will either be called when the next drive is held in the county or there will be articles in *The Saint Francis Herald* and *Bird City Times*.
