Earlier in the week they had lost to Cambridge and scored a win over Resurrection Christian. Cambridge had entered the tournament with an undefeated record but suffered their first loss of the season in the Championship game when they lost to Quinter, a Northwest Kansas League team.

The tournament ended with Quinter placing first, Cambridge second, Oberlin third, Hoxie fourth, Dundy County fifth, St. Francis sixth, Resurrection Christian seventh and Atwood eighth.

Indian Michael Raile was honored by being named to the All-Tournament Team while Jonathan Roelfs' grade point average qualified him for the All-Academic Team. Adam Peterparticipated in the free-throw competition and placed a nice second for his efforts.

The Indians will resume action on the home court Friday night, when the Wildcats from Sharon Springs visit for a non-league game.

St. Francis now stands 4-10 overall and are 0-4 in league action.

Cambridge shut down the Indians offensively Tuesday night and walked away with a 65-19 victory.
