

The many programs which the Conservation District assists in were listed including the development of the Environmental Quality Incentive Program, Water Resources Cost-Share Program and the Non-Point Source Pollution Cost-Share Program as well as new conservation, irrigation development and Crop Rotation Planting plans and revisions of current plans.

The District, through the Water Resources Cost-Share Program, received \$37,286 for cost-sharing on conservation practices. Fourteen contracts were approved for assistance on rangeland management,

The Legend of the Teardrop






