"This was a very disappointing game for us for the simple fact that we were on the losing end," assistant coach Jared Sowers said. "We wanted to rebound from our loss to Goodland from earlier in the season, and with this being the first round of the tournament, there was added motivation.

"We played outstanding offense and defense for three and a half quarters, but we all know that a game has four quarters.

"You have to give them (Goodland) credit, however, they were down 19-8 with a little over 3 minutes to go and put together a 12-0 run to end the game utilizing a man-to-man press that I didn't have the girls prepared for.
