"Overall the effort the girls put forth was good. We have some outstanding schools in the Northwest Kansas League and if we are going to compete we are going to have to improve in the fundamental areas, dribbling, passing, catching, and shooting.

The 2003-04 team finished the season with a 5-16 overall record and a 0-7 league record.

Wins this year came at the expense of Cheyenne Wells, Holyoke, Resurrection Christian, Sharon Springs and Cheylin. The Ladies placed eighth in the Sagebrush Classic in December and seventh in the Oberlin Invitational in January (defeated Resurrection Christian).
