The players did not disappoint the large crowd on hand for the event.

The girls game ended with the Dark Jersey's winning 70-66 after leading 38-33 at halftime.

The Dark Jersey's were led by Scott City's Sheena Kuntzsch's 13 points. Colby's Ivy Ramsey and the Grinnell tandem of Tanya Beckman and Erin Bixenman all contributed 12 points, while Andrea Vap of LaCrosse was also in double figures with 11.
