## Junior Miss wins second runner-up

Seventeen teenage girls from across Kansas competed for a share of \$6,250 in college scholarships on Saturday and Sunday at the Belleville High School and the 2004 Cheyenne County Junior Miss walked away with \$900 of it.

Hayley Young, Bird City and Cheylin senior, was the second runner-up in the contest, receiving a \$400 cash scholarship, as well as a \$500 award for overall scholastics. Rawlins County Junior Miss, Kylie Dixson, who is also a senior at Cheylin, received the \$100 community service award.

Jennifer Jones of Salina was awarded the title of Kansas' Junior Miss 2004 and a \$2,500 cash scholarship. In addition to winning the title, Miss Jones won the \$300 overall talent award and the \$200 overall interview award. She will go on to compete in the nationally televised America's Junior Miss Finals in Mobile, Ala., in June, where she will have the opportunity to win a share of more than \$200,000 in cash scholarships.

The first runner-up, Kimberly Streit of Tipton, received a \$600 cash scholarship. The third runner-up was Stacy Johnson of Concordia and Amanda Bruna of Hanover was the fourth runner-up.

Hayley said, "There were a lot of great girls there, I was really honored with (second runner-up)."

"Hayley did a wonderful job representing Cheyenne County and did an awesome job in the Poise and Fitness Categories," said Vicki Cress, chairman of the county Jun-

ior Miss Program.

She added that her jazz dance was also "right on cue."

"Cheyenne County couldn't have been prouder," she said.

Kylie won the community service award for an essay she wrote about a play which second graders from Cheylin Elementary performed about the solar system. The second graders presented the play to the senior citizens.

The question for the poise portion of the program, "describe how a sport or hobby has taught you a lesson in discipline or team work?" was asked to each of the contestant on Saturday night.

Hayley's answer was, "While track is not considered a 'team sport,' my freshman year I was part of a relay team along with three other girls who had gone on to state the year before. I really thought it was my responsibility to be disciplined in my training so I would fulfill my own expectations and not let down the other members of my team."

Kylie answered the question, "4-H has helped me do things I really didn't always want to do, but I learned discipline and saw the rewards."

The 2005 Cheyenne County Junior Miss program will be held June 26. Mrs. Cress said there have been 14 Cheyenne County girls showing interest in the upcoming program which will have the theme "Goin' Country."

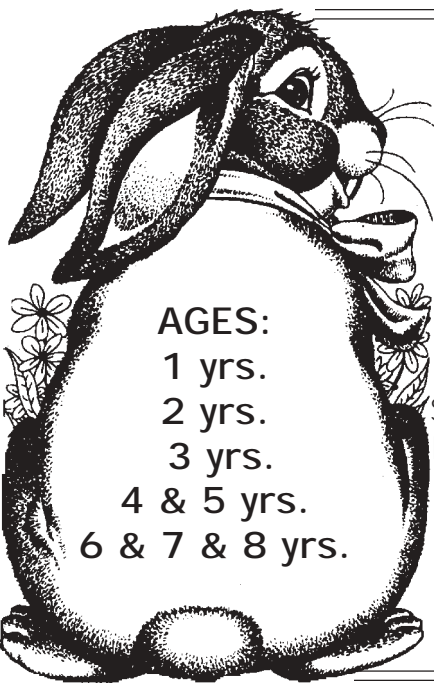

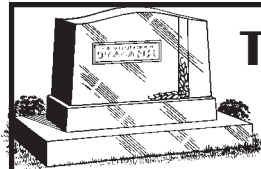
