

Weather spotter training is held

Weather Spotter Training meeting held Monday evening in St. Francis drew a crowd of 40 people concerned about severe weather and giving information to the National Weather Service in Goodland.

David Floyd, warning meteorologist with the National Weather tornado or severe weather and when to call a possible serious condition into the Service.

Mr. Floyd said that last year, there were 91 tornadoes reported in Kansas and that is 39 above the normal number. He also said that most tornadoes occur between the hours of noon and midnight and most tornadoes are reported in May. In fact, on May 8, there were 21 tornadoes re-

However, tornadoes have been reported as early as February and as late as December.

If there is a tornado warning, people are urged to go to the basement or to an interior room on the the head and body from flying de-

If away from home, go to an infloor and stay away from glassedin areas or wide-span roofs such as auditoriums and warehouses. crouch down and cover the head. open to the south or the west.

If in a car or mobile home, people are advised to abandon them immediately as most deaths from tornadoes occur in cars or mobile homes.

If there is no suitable structure nearby, lie flat in the nearest ditch

The Cheyenne County Severe with your hands.

Always be prepared for a tornado by having a store of clean covered containers of water and a disaster supply kit which includes a flashlight, candles, matches and a radio.
