No one files for attorney

Kevin Berens, present county attorney, will not be running for office this term. In fact, there are no candidates wanting to fill the county attorney seat.

The Cheyenne County Commissioners, at their June 30 meeting, were concerned about what is going to be done about having a legal counsel and having a county attorney. The salary paid to the county attorney is around \$24,000 plus the benefits and other expenses, all totalling \$32,540.

Commissioner Krien said the governor would appoint someone to take the position until the next election. Commissioner Ron Krien had talked to several commissioners from other counties and they said they paid considerably more to obtain and keep a county attorney. The commissioners will be setting the budget in the near future and thought the county attorney's fund might need an increase.

Commissioner Krien said there had been some interest in filling the position but, if they accepted the position, the attorney would need a full-time secretary. Attorney Berens said he would submit a budget that included a full-time secretary. Commissioner Tim Raile asked if there was enough work to require a full-time secretary? The answer was "yes," that there are so many cases these days that a secretary could be kept busy full-time.

The St. Francis Lions Club met on Monday, July 12. Third Vice President Clarence Iliff opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and Norman Morrow gave the invocation.

Lion Iliff announced that he had received the "Support Our Troops" magnetic ribbon decals and asked members to take some with them to begin the sales. The price for the ribbons will be \$4 for one, \$7 for two and \$9 for three decals.

He emphasized his capability to work within an assigned budget and the need for a hard clear policy on drug enforcement. Mr. Kribs expressed his concern about open cases and said he would make every effort to process cases quickly and efficiently. He indicated he is a team builder and encouraged feedback from the county residents. He said if anyone had questions, to contact him and he would give them a straight answer.
