

School is planned

Western Prairie Resource Conservation and Development Area, Inc., will be holding a three-day Rangeland Management Advanced School. This will be held on Aug. 25 through Aug. 27 at the Methodist Camp Lakeside, Scott Lake, Scott City.

Educators from Kansas State University, University of Missouri, Natural Resources Conservation Service, and ranchers will provide information on developing management plans. The school is split into classroom and infield activities.

The first day will be an introductory overview of rangeland management. Registration will begin at 9 a.m. That evening Kit Pharo, eastern Colorado rancher, will be the guest speaker.

The second day will be more intense one-on-one training on planning options. The participants will learn how to identify problems, opportunities and concerns on managing rangeland. They will inventory their resources, evaluate alternatives, and learn plan implementation and

The final day students will be working with; range condition calculations; grazing duration and stocking rates; grazing dates; percentage grazing; and plotting grazing schedules.
