Teacher awarded

Lucille Rossbach, Idalia High School teacher, was surprised with a Yuma County Outstanding Teacher Award, presented during the school's end-of-year Academic Awards Night by Jobediah Rittenhouse, Student Council president.

Mrs. Rossbach graduated from Wartburg College, Waverly, Iowa, with a bachelor of arts in English and religion. She received a masters of arts in reading from the University of Northern Colorado and a masters of arts in literary students from the Bread Loaf School of English at Oxford University, United Kingdom. She previously taught in Waterloo, Iowa; Herington and Lost Springs; and Bennett, Colo. For the past 14 years, she was Idalia's high school English teacher.

Students at Idalia High School chose to nominate Mrs. Rossbach for the award, conspired to get a copy of her resume, and wrote a letter of recommendation which included, "However, while her resume and portfolio are quite impressive, this is not only what puts Lucille Rossbach above and beyond the level of an or-

inary teacher. She 'cares about students academically and about them personally.' Described as a 'super woman,' Mrs. Rossbach provides an excellent source of knowledge and...it is obvious to see her skill as a teacher and provider of knowledge. She teaches with confidence in her material and is always interested to learn something new from the students...

"She is willing to work with students on an individual basis and her concern is not on the grade, but the effort and knowledge taken from the assignment...Mrs. Rossbach is a teacher that does more than provide students with the necessary learning for them to succeed in their future; but one 'can always count on her to offer the best advice.' She is available to students outside of class and is willing to bend around their schedules before her own."

Aging and Alcohol Abuse

Alcohol abuse by seniors and in the elderly is sometimes called a hidden epidemic because its symptoms often mimic or are masked by common physical and mental infirmities of aging, such as lessened alertness, depression, anxiety and diminished physical capacity. Also, doctors rarely ask their elderly patients when and how much they drink or what effect it has on their lives. Various circumstances common among older people can increase the risk of alcohol abuse, even in someone who has never had a previous alcohol problem. Retirement may result in a loss of structure, self-esteem and income and an increase in loneliness and boredom. Other losses such as spouses, friends, physical well-being or independence as well as pain or sleep problems may also prompt older people to turn to alcohol.

The effects of a given amount of alcohol can be greatly exaggerated

in an older person because the physical body that is consuming alcohol at age 65 and older is not the same as the one that drank at age 45. In addition, as people age, there is a decline in a stomach enzyme that starts to break down alcohol before it reaches the bloodstream. Blood alcohol levels in older people are typically 30 to 40 percent higher than in younger people who consume the same amount of alcohol. But even at equivalent blood alcohol levels, older people are more likely than the middle aged to experience intoxication, cognitive difficulties and problems with balance and coordination. In other words, tolerance for alcohol declines, and the risks of excessive drinking rise with age. In addition, an older person who take medication for arthritis, depression, hypertension, heart disease and other ailments can also be at increased risk as even the moderate intake of alcohol can result in negative interactions with these medications.
