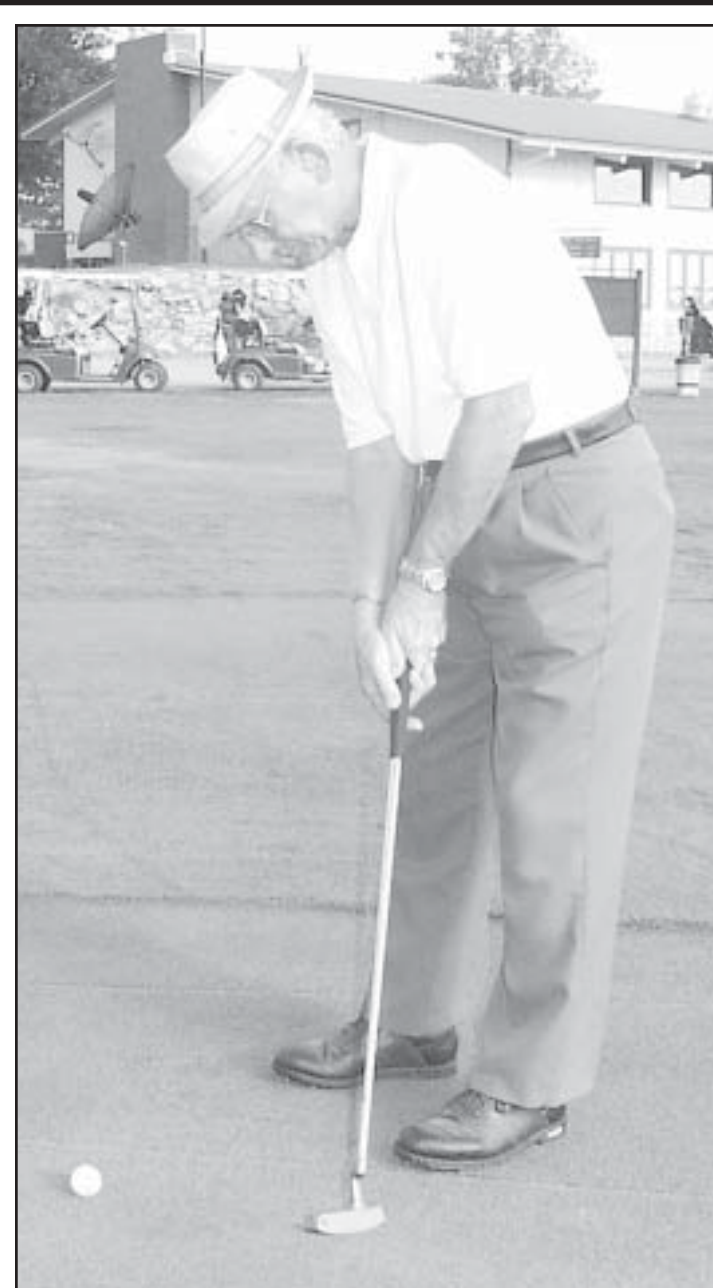

Board makes last minute decisions

School is just weeks away and the St. Francis Board of Education is making last minute decisions. Signing the contract for the high school basketball coach and releasing the daytime custodian were among the items of business discussed when the board met for a special meeting

on July 26.

Prior to the meeting, Ward Cassidy, counselor in the high school, had agreed to coach the high school boys' basketball team. He will be the only coach this year as the team is estimated to be fairly small.

There are two vacancies which

will need to be filled including an assistant coach in high school girls' basketball and a co-sponsor of the high school cheerleading squad.

The board accepted the resignation of Vicki Killingsworth who had been the high school daytime custodian. Superintendent Carl Werner said Mrs. Killingsworth had accepted a position as a school head cook in Goodland. He also noted that her children will continue to attend the St. Francis schools.

Actually, the special meeting was set to review and approve the proposed budget for fiscal year 2005. The new breakfast and lunch ticket prices were reviewed first and it was also mentioned that the textbook rental fees would remain the same: kindergarten, \$10; and grades one through 12, \$15.

The 2005 fiscal year budget is projected to remain the same as last year at 34.152 mills. Following the review and more discussion, the board approved the budget to be printed in *The Saint Francis Herald*.

The budget hearing will be held at the next board meeting on Aug. 12. The board and administration will be continuing to look for a used coach-type activity bus. It was noted that when, and if, a good used bus is found, the administration will need to take action very quickly. The board agreed to authorize the administration to send out a request for bids on a used activity bus. Bids will be acted on at a meeting before a bus is purchased.

The next regular meeting of the board of education has been set for 8 p.m. on Aug. 12.
