Nine Polish runners came through St. Francis and on to Oberlin on U.S. 36 last week, headed from Los Angeles to New

Their spokesman, Jacek Domanski, said that the group was not trying to raise money for anything. They were running to commemorate the Polish uprising of 60 years ago and the Sept. 11 attacks on the United States.

Many of the runners do not speak English, including Ted Domanski, who had stopped between Oberlin and Norcatur to adjust his gear and wait for the van carrying equipment

Polish uprising, 1944

By late summer 1944, the Ger-Poles. mans had occupied Poland for five years. The Polish Home Army, loyal to an exile government in London, started an offensive on Aug. 1, 1944. The soldiers attacked the German garrison at Warsaw with Molotov cocktails, outdated rifles, captured German guns and a few Allied weapons which had been smuggled into the

The Russian army was advancing, but stopped on the outskirts of Warsaw and stayed there without going further for most of two months while the fighting continued between the Germans and

By October, according to "The Second World War" by John Keegan, the Germans had pretty much destroyed not only the Polish Home Army, but also much of Warsaw.

Scholars believe that Soviet Premier Joseph Stalin wanted the Polish army out of the way and let the Germans take care of the problem for him.

This is believed to have caused one of the first breaks in the Soviet-American-English alliance, which eventually led to the Cold War.
