Seatbelt rate goes up, fatalities down

A 7.1 percent drop in Kansas motor vehicle fatalities in 2003 and an increase in seatbelt usage are encouraging and steps in the right direction.

"I'm pleased that fewer families suffered the loss of loved ones in traffic accidents and I'm heartened that more Kansans are using seatbelts," said Sec. Miller.

According to a 2002-2003 National Highway Traffic Safety Administration statistic report just released by the Department of Transportation.

Kansas had the eighth largest percentage decrease among the states in fatalities from 2002 to 2003. The state had 507 fatalities in 2002 and 471 in 2003.

In addition to the drop in the actual number of fatalities, Kansas' fatality rate dropped approximately 9 percent. This rate is based on fatalities divided by the number of vehicle miles traveled on Kansas roadways.

Plain Sense

"Rewarding Children"

How to discipline their child effectively is something that most parents struggle with. Much is said and written about the use of rewards, praise, and positive reinforcement.

According to Stephen Bavelke, PhD, author of the "Nurturing Program for Parents and Children", using objects, gifts or money as rewards for good behavior can have various results.

Often though, this reward technique is misused. According to Bavelke, when the great percentage of rewards children receive are "things", there is a risk that children will learn that behaving leads to the acquisition of materials goods,

rather than learning to behave because it is the right or appropriate thing to do. The result can be a child who responds based on the attitude of "What am I going to get if I behave?"

Bavelke suggests that rather than using material objects or money as reward, parents would benefit greatly from learning techniques that include the use of praise and nurturing touch.

Not only when they've done something special, but on a regular basis, just because they are special.
