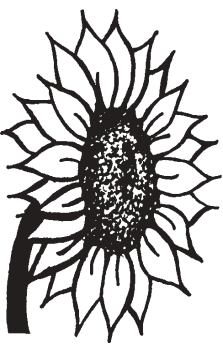

"It was a relaxed game," Mr. McCormick said, "Similar to a pick-up game at a family get together."

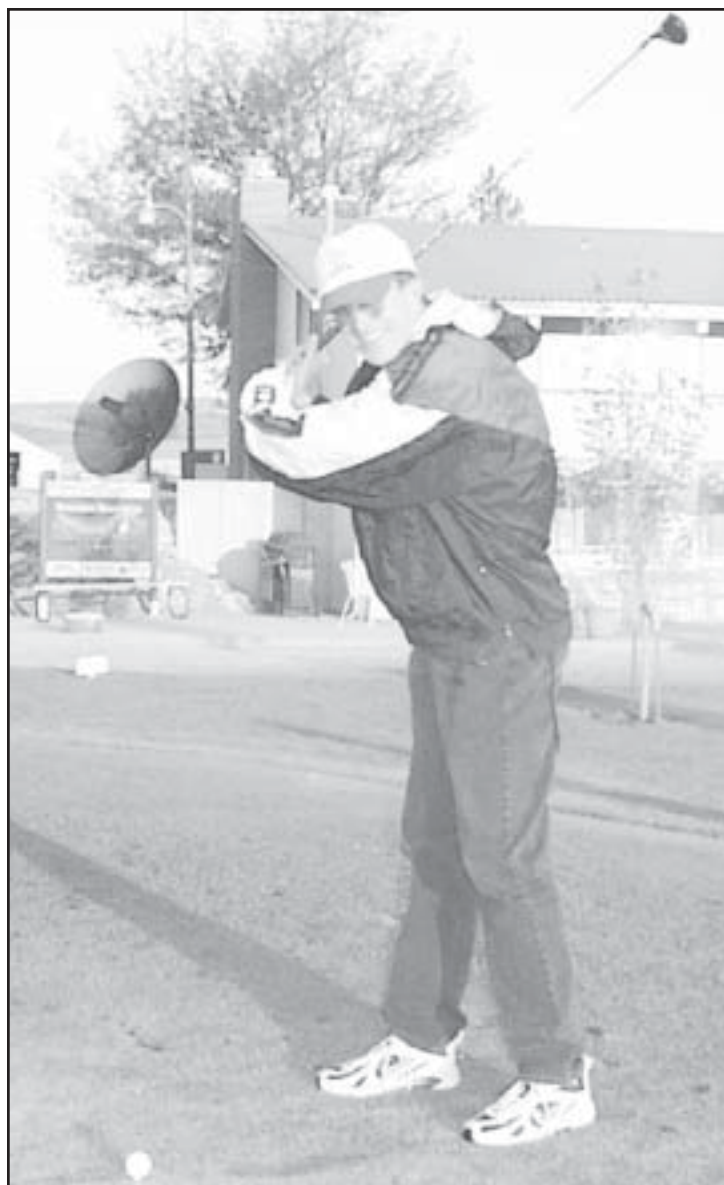

This has become a regular event that allows family members and friends from the two states to join for a good cause.

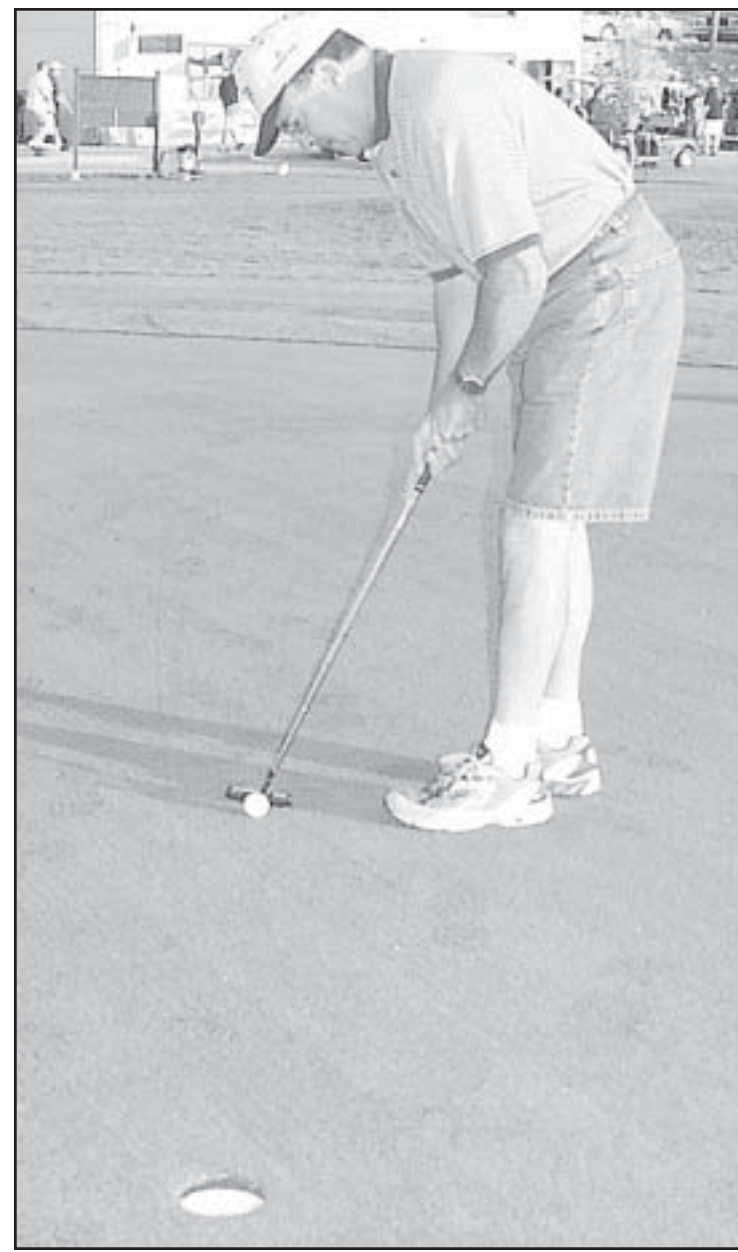


MATT SMULL (left) and Roger Lauer greet Tom Quiggle (in golf cart) early Saturday morning before the tournament action begins.
