#### Volunteers needed when disaster occurs

With the attacks on our country in 2001, as well as the continued threats against the United States, it has become necessary for the nation to prepare for a bioterrorism attack. County Health Departments are continually in preparation mode. The County Health Department has been updating the Bioterrorism Response and Preparedness Plan. This plan outlines the roles and responsibilities of the County Health Department when a bioterrorism or disaster event occurs. One of the aspects of this plan is

the preparation for a mass vaccination or prophylactic dispersal clinic if deemed necessary. For each resident to be successfully taken care of within the short time frame the state

has set forth there needs to be local volunteers to assist with paperwork County Health Department is looking for volunteers to help if an attack or disaster occurs. If there is a call for a mass vaccination/prophylaxis clinic, the Cheyenne County Health Department is asking you to help out. This need could occur for a variety of biological agents or another disaster situation. The health department is making plans to provide training for all volunteers. Those with a medical background are also asked to volunteer to help.

 Parents naturally become concerned about a child who takes things that don't belong to them. This should not be regarded as "stealing" until the child is capable of understanding the consequences of such behavior, which is usually between ages 3 to 5 years old. Parents should consider why their child has stolen; is it for more attention, or showing off to enne County Fair a success. I would a friend, to have something to give to someone else, or to get something they don't want to ask for.

Parents should teach children about property rights and consideration of others. Parents must also serve as positive role models. If adults bring home items from their place of work, or allow a mistake at the supermarket checkout to occur in their favor, it will be harder for a child to understand the concept of honesty.

In most cases, stealing will stop

as the child grows older, if parents take proper measures. Teach your child that stealing is wrong and is not acceptable within the family or the community. Guide him or her in returning the stolen object to the proper owner; if for some in such family situations. Your reason it cannot be returned then help the child in arranging to pay for or replace the item. When the item has been returned or paid for, give the child praise for their ef-

fort and work.

If stealing is persistent or accompanied by other problem behaviors, it may be a sign of more serious emotional problems that both child and parents need help with. Distrust can develop quickly local mental health professional can assist in evaluating the causes for the behavior, and work with those involved to reestablish better relationships and more healthy behaviors.
