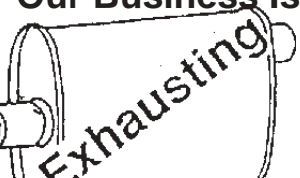

Bike rider passes through St. Francis

Every year, there are a variety of walkers, runners or those riding bikes passing through St. Francis on their way down U.S. 36. Recently, Bruce Hamilton was one of those people.

Mr. Hamilton said he was a 56-year-old male suffering from coronary disease, Type 2 diabetes, marginally high blood pressure and obesity (at least by today's new standards) but, most importantly, he was suffering from clinical depression.

"I guess in some ways I could be described as a casualty (not a victim) of the World Trade Center incident as I began a new job in New York on Sept. 10, 2001 and was headed for the Boston airport on the morning of 9-11 to catch an American Airlines flight," he said.

"The saga goes on to include being locked inside a train in New York's Penn Station with many evacuees from Manhattan as they announced a bomb threat was preventing us from moving forward to not being able to leave the train at Newark's Penn Station due to a shooting right outside the building."

Sixty days later, Mr. Hamilton packed up and went back to Ohio.

"I have fought the clinical depression and unemployment ever since," he said.

He had hit bottom and was faced with going to a homeless shelter.

He left Columbus, Ohio, on May 10 on a bike pulling a cart which contained a tent, sleeping bag and a few basic necessities. He was headed to Phoenix, a 2,000 mile trip which he would make alone.

What he did not count on was the transformation his life would make during the trip.

On Aug. 23, he noted in his journal that his journey had taken him to southern California and the Saddleback Church, the home church of Rick Warren, the author of "The Purpose Driven Life." In the book, there is the sentence, "It's not about me."

His travels have led him to meet

a variety of people, many who were suffering with clinical depression.

The first day on the road, he was met by a woman who asked if she could pray for him. Of course he was open to any help he could get. She asked him if he was looking for a church, which he replied that he was, and she invited him to worship with her and others in their little church.

"Sometimes I think I am a 'depression magnet,'" he said, noting that people seemed to come to him. One day, he had felt sick. He had stopped five times before deciding to go on. Just over the hill was a man walking toward him. The walker said his van driver had dropped him off only five minutes before. He also was suffering from depression and they ended up at his van where they talked.

"Had I not stopped those times, I would have missed him.

At the rim of the Grand Canyon, he met with a group of teenagers who were all wearing shirts with "It's not about me," printed on them. As he talked to them, they invited him to church and, after talking to the adult leader, he was asked to give the sermon.

"This has been a 'journey of faith,'" Mr. Hamilton said.

When he started his journey, he had \$40 on him but, shortly after he had left, his daughter called to tell him that he had received a check for \$500. While he has had many rewarding and uplifting experiences, he has had some bad luck. On Saturday, he lost his hat and, in the process, swerved, but a car hit him. He was not injured but the cart carrying his belongings was hit. He has gotten it back together but the tires are wearing thin. He has met with 29 storms, a tornado, two hail storms, a sandstorm and a near-miss lightning strike of 15 feet. He was also was robbed once and hospitalized for heat exhaustion and dehydration.

He is on his way back to Ohio, an expected 4,000 mile round trip. He is returning with a greater faith in God and is looking forward to

seeing his five daughters.

When he was working, he was a salesman earning around \$50,000 a year. He doesn't know for sure what he will be doing once he gets back but he has a story to tell.

"I'm planning on writing a book

and would also like to speak to groups on my experiences and how I dealt with clinical depression," he said.

Plain Sense

Child Psychiatry

The field of mental health includes many kinds of service providers including psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, counselors, and case managers. One of many specialists in the field is that of child psychiatrist. A child and adolescent psychiatrist is a physician who specializes in the diagnosis and treatment of disorders of thinking, feeling and behavior that affect children, adolescents and their families. Their education and training requires four years of medical school, at least three years of approved residency training in medicine, neurology and general psychiatry with adults, and two years of additional specialized training in psychiatric work with children, adolescents and their families. Special importance is given to disorders that appear in childhood such as pervasive developmental disorder, attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), learning disabilities, mental retardation, mood disorders, depressive and anxiety disorders, drug dependency and delinquency (conduct disorder).

The child and adolescent psychiatrist uses knowledge of biological,

psychological and social factors in working with clients, with attention to physical, genetic, developmental, emotional, cognitive, educational, family, peer and social components. The psychiatrist arrives at a diagnosis, then in conjunction with the client and the family, designs a treatment plan to help those involved to work towards a successful outcome. This integrated approach may involve individual, group or family psychotherapy, medication, or consultation with others involved including schools, juvenile courts, social agencies or other community organizations.

Child and adolescent psychiatrists can be located by contacting local mental health centers, hospitals, school counselors, family physicians and national organizations like the American Psychiatric Association.

Plain Sense

Children and Divorce

Dear Plain Sense: I am in the process of divorce and wondering how this might affect my children. What do I tell them? How do I explain what is going on?

While the adults involved in ending a relationship might be devastated as well as relieved, the children who are involved will probably be felling, in the least, confused, worried and even frightened. Divorce can be misinterpreted by children unless parents provide some explanation. Children often believe they have caused the conflict between their parents and feel that the divorce is their fault. Parents do not have to explain all the personal problems that have brought an end to the marriage, but they do need to reassure their children that they are not to blame.

Children most often worry that they will have to move to a new house, leave their best friends, or attend a different school. Thus it is important that parents talk to their children about pending changes, as well as allowing them to ask questions. Very young children will react more so to the obvious changes,

such as a parent's continuing absence or a move to another location. Older children who have a more mature concept of the issues will have reactions related to their personal sense of loyalty and fairness.

Parents should be alert to signs of distress in their children. Young children tend to react with behavior changes such as angry outbursts, being uncooperative, or withdrawing. Older children will experience more of the sense of loss and feelings of sadness; their schoolwork may suffer, or they, too, may exhibit some behavior changes. When things settle down and life is back to a sense of normalcy, such behaviors should diminish. If problems continue, and especially when parents become concerned about their children, it may be necessary to seek professional help. Counseling and therapy for families and couples dealing with divorce can be very beneficial for all involved.
