The Sainty Indians now have a record, having beaten Colby, Oberlin and Quinter. Their losses were to Goodland, Oakley and now, Hoxie. On Friday, they will be hitting the road, traveling to Syracuse on Friday with the game starting at 7:30 p.m. (Games so far this year have been played at 7

The Indians will be playing their first district game this Friday. Syracuse will be followed by Wichita County/Leoti and then the Atwood Buffaloes. These are the teams which will make up District 13. The two top teams in the district will advance to post-sea-
