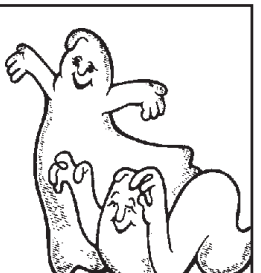

First Oberlin art festival set for April

Organizers are planning to bring professional artists and students to show at the first High Plains ArtFest, drawing high school juniors and seniors from more than 30 area schools and art fans from across the tri-state region in April.

The adult and student art show and sale at The Gateway in Oberlin will target the tri-state region. Community college instructors also are being informed about the event.

"An art show and sale is something that has not recently been attempted in our region," said Connie Grafel, Gateway marketing director, "but we hope that this event will offer an opportunity for local artists, photographers, potters and others, to display their works. We see the event as offering something new and different for residents in the Tri-State area."

High Plains ArtFest will kick-off with an invitation-only gala reception honoring all artists and their guests on Friday evening, April 8. The public showing begins at 9 a.m. Saturday and will conclude at 3 p.m. Sunday.

The event follows the Northwest Kansas League high school art show, which will also be held at The Gateway on Tuesday through Thursday of that week.

The idea for a regional art show was suggested by Norcatur arts and theater enthusiast Ron Temple. That sparked interest by several groups, including the Oberlin Arts and Humanities Commission. Their membership and program director, Mary Henzel, came forward to help get the proposal off the ground.

Area artists and art supporters are urged to volunteer their time to make this event a success. Anyone interested in helping on a committee should call Ms. Grafel at 785-475-2901 or Mrs. Henzel at 785-475-3329.

A Spectacular Gala Reception in the Gateway arena opening night will offer food and drink for artists and guests who are entering their works. Patrons who make a \$100 donation to attend the gala will be voting on the "People's Choice Award Winners."

Area musicians will play during an "Art Walk" that evening. Patrons will have first chance at purchasing any of the works on display. Award winners in all of the eight categories will be recog-

nized and introduced during the evening.

All works will be judged and all sales will include a 20 percent commission for the High Plains ArtFest committee so the event can continue in the future.

Separate prospecti for adult and student entries will be mailed early this fall. Arts clubs in the area are being contacted, as well as professional artists, and a list of more than 400 names has been built.

"There are many unknown artists in our region," Ms. Grafel said, "and the organizers are attempting to make contacts in most of the communities so word about the upcoming event gets out as much as possible."

Entries are being accepted in categories including watercolor, acrylic, oils, pastels, sculpture, hand-made ceramics, photography and other works that include drawings, graphics, mixed media, computer generated and batik processes.

Some of the budget will come from grants through the Kansas Arts Commission and the Hansen Foundation of Logan. Other money sources are being contacted and prize money for the event will exceed \$2,200.

"In contacting area high schools, we have learned that many are dropping their art programs," Ms. Grafel said. "Therefore, every venue for promoting the arts must be utilized to its fullest extent. Our committee sees this unique and unusual event for the Tri-State region as another opportunity to promote a variety of artistic skills that often go unnoticed in rural communities."

"We hope to make this a special event that will grow in the years ahead and bring great exposure to new works of local artists and student artists."

"In addition, involving several hundred professional and amateur artists along with students should bring an influx of people into Oberlin for a fun weekend, plus a unique opportunity for artisans on the high plains to showcase their best and be recognized for their efforts."

The organizing committee expects to meet at least once a month through April, she said, and is open to suggestions on what could be done to make the weekend attractive to people here and visitors from surrounding states.
