Indians defeat Wichita County Friday; play Atwood in final District 13 contest

The Indian football team moved one step closer to the 2A football playoffs when they defeated Leoti/ Wichita County 44-0 on Friday night at Greene Field. This win gives them a 2-0 District 13 record with only Atwood left to play.

Friday evening Syracuse defeated Atwood leaving the standings as follows: St. Francis 2-0, Syracuse 1-1, Leoti-Wichita County 1-1 and Atwood 0-2. Because St. Francis has already

defeated both Syracuse and Leoti/ Wichita County, even a loss to Atwood would put Sainty at the top of District 13 as they have already defeated the only other schools that could have a 2-1 record (Syracuse or Leoti/Wichita County) in District 13.

The top two teams in the District 13 will move into bi-district games to be held on Tuesday, Nov. 2. St. Francis, as the top team in District 13, will host the second place team in District 14 (the loser of the Oakley-WaKeeney/Trego County game). The Tuesday match up will be played at Greene Field in St. Francis. Check Indian News (332-8111) for time.

St. Francis received the ball shortly thereafter when Wichita County could not collected the 10yards for a first down.

One other touchdown was scored in the first inning. The time on the clock was 2:14 when Derek Ross reached the end zone from 25-yards out. Sainty began the series on their own 23-yard line with Matt Brown earning a number of yards on a quarterback sneak. A Brown to Adam Peter conversion play pass put Sainty

up 16-0. In the second quarter Sainty scored three times. The first touchdown came midway through the quarter after the Indians had mounted a nice scoring drive. Gabe Smull earned the touchdown after he, Ross and J. McAtee successfully moved the ball into Wichita County territory, collecting five first downs along the way. Ross added the two after-touchdown points on a run.

Peter added another good play when he recovered the ball which Wichita County bobbled on the kickoff. Sainty was on the 45-yard line. Two plays placed Sainty down on the 11-yard line but then a flag moved them back and they were in a fourth-and-eight situation. At this time Brown hit J. McAtee in the end zone for six.
