Time to insulate water meters before winter

The temperatures have been warm and almost summer-like but the change is coming. Toward the end of the week, winter temperatures are predicted to be here. J.R. Landenberger, city superintendent, asks that people not wait until the snow flies to insulate their water meters.

"By insulating your water meters now, you will be ready for cold weather. If the water meter should freeze, it could be a costly project," he said, adding that it is much easier to insulate the meter before the meter lid is frozen to the ground or covered with snow.

There are several ways of insulating the meter including filling it with a piece of the pink insulation used for insulating homes. Other ways are to fill a plastic bag with packing peanuts, sealing it and placing it in the hole or purchasing a special foam cover.

Residents are reminded to not stuff leaves, rags or rugs in the meter hole as they will become wet and freeze, making more of a

hazard instead of insulating. Besides, wet leaves are not fun for the resident to clean out when spring comes.

Those who are not able to cover their meters are asked to call the city office at 785-332-3142 for help.
