In the opening round of volleyball competition Team 1 defeated Team 3 and Team 2 defeated Team 4

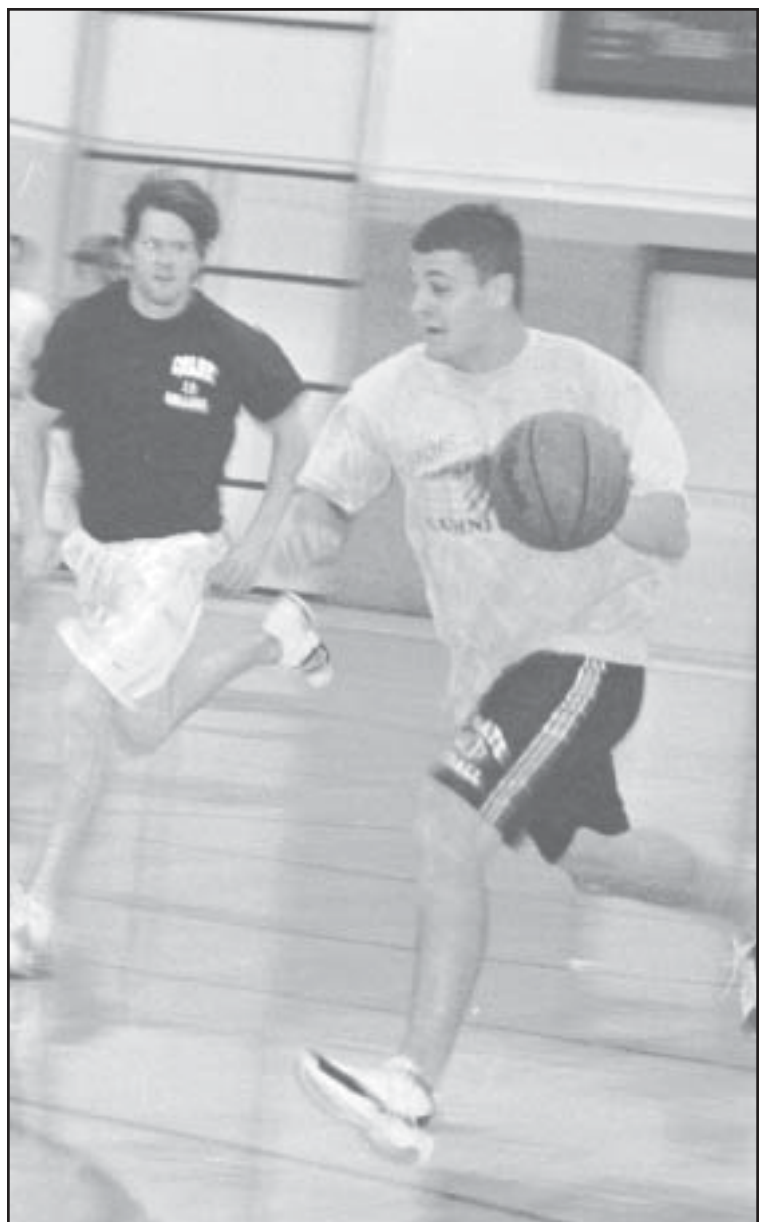
