What to do with pasture hurt by years of drought In exchange for the incentive or plication and a self-assessment

Nine years of drought have taken their toll on the grasslands of Cheyenne County and the surrounding area. In many pastures, up to 50 percent of the grass plants have died out, leaving bare ground that provides a spot for weedy species to sprout and grow whenever rain showers grace the plains. Cattle numbers are down and, in some cases, whole herds have been sold.

These are stressful times for ranchers. Difficult questions surface: Is the drought over? Will my grass recover to pre-drought conditions? How long will it take? When do I start rebuilding my herd? Should I rebuild my herd to predrought conditions? Can I afford to keep my cow herd numbers down? How will these decisions affect my grass? My pocketbook?

For ranchers struggling with these questions, there is help through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program under the Grazing Land Health resource concern. The program is designed to help ranchers make long term management changes that will result in improved grasslands. Incentive payments are made for three years to help softened the blow of these changes; cost-share is available if structural practices (i.e. well, pipeline, cross-fence, etc.) are needed. Contracts last one year longer than the last paid practice, but usually are from four to five years.

agrees to three main things: (1) half of whatever grows in any one year is to remain on the grass plant (key specie) at the end of the growing season; (2) exclusion cages will be installed to help monitor this use; and (3) a level of rest (determined by the landowner) will be provided during the growing season.

Ranchers who are interested in this program should visit the conservation office located in the United States Department of Agriculture Service Center on West Highway 36 in Saint Francis. Deadline for consideration for the 2005 program year is January 21. An ap-
