## It's another win forIndiansquad

Champions again! This weekend the St. Francis Indian wrestlers defeated mat men from 20 Kansas schools ranging from 6A to 2-1A to win the championship of the Prairie Classic in Hays. This tournament features some very tough competition and this is the first time the Indians have come home with the championship trophy. St. Francis began attending this event in 1997.

The Indians accumulated 188 points to defeat the second place team, Goodland by 12.5 points.

"Overall we wrestled well." Coach Larry Gabel said. "We are improving each week. We are headed in the right direction,"
