Eight wrestlers qualify to compete at 3-2-1A tourney

Norton with 208 points took home the crown from the 3-2-1A WaKeeney Regional Wrestling Tournament held Friday and Saturday. Oakley placed second (180 points) and St. Francis third (163.5).

"This was a very tough tournament, the toughest in the state," Coach Larry Gabel said. "At times we did well and at times not as well as we are capable of.

"I am pleased to take eight kids (Trevor Richard, Dylan Loyd, Gavin Smull, Jordan Gienger, Gabe Gienger, Derek Ross, Brennon Wilger and Gabe Walz) to State. Everyone of them is capable of placing."

"Josh Carpenter had one win and two losses," Coach Gabel said. "The two kids he lost to have qualified for State. I am happy with his improvement this year.


