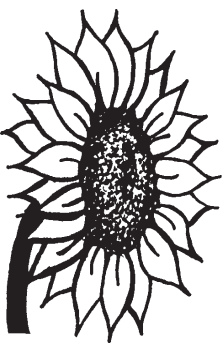

Ladies have two games this week

The St. Francis Lady Indians scored 40 points against Wallace County/Sharon Springs on Monday night, Feb. 14, and 35 points against Quinter on Friday night but neither effort resulted in a victory for the Sainty Ladies. Wallace County won the first game by a reasonably small margin of 52-40 while Quinter took a 61-35 victory. Results of the Lady Indian/Lady Buffaloes (Rawlins County) game on Tuesday night in St. Francis will be published next week.

**Sharon Springs 52,
St. Francis 40**

Even though St. Francis scored 15 points in the final quarter compared to 12 for Wallace County could not close the 40-25 gap at the end of the third quarter so the final score was Sharon Springs 52, St. Francis 40.

A very low scoring first quarter (4 points) proved to be hard to overcome, although the Lady Wildcats did not produce many more points (8) in this period.

Megan Rice stepped up and scored 11 points for Sainty. The remainder of the points were scattered among seven players.

Sainty was 2-of-7 from three-point range, 11-of-45 from two-point range and 12-of-21 from the line. They had a better percentage from the line than the Lady Wildcats but it was an area that could have produced a closer game.

Twenty-nine rebounds were pulled down by St. Francis, two more than by Wallace County. Nearly the entire team contributed in this area with no one player in double figures.

Five assists were recorded with Amy Grace having three. St. Francis and Wallace County were nearly alike in turnovers with Sainty having

Quinter 61, St. Francis 35

The St. Francis/Quinter game was the exact opposite of the game earlier in the week. This time St. Francis scored the majority of their points in the first two quarters but had a tough time scoring as the game progressed.

Quinter played consistently throughout the evening, scoring in double figures each quarter.

A. Grace scored 11 for the Lady Indians with 5-of-7 attempts from the field falling through the hoop and 1-of-3 free throws being successful.

Sainty had a 34.2 percentage from the field with 13-of-38 attempts but from the line they were below their average as they fell below 50 percent to 38.9 percent. From the field, A. Grace was 71.4 percent (5-of-7) while Jade DeGood was next with 1-of-2 for 50 percent. Two players, Zimbelman (1/2) and Rice (2/4) were 50 percent from the line.

Rice also had six rebounds with Zimbelman, Dunn and A. Grace each contributing five. Rice had four assists. Quinter had very few turnovers for the evening, just reaching a total of 10.

St. Francis was defeated by Wallace County/Sharon Springs and by Quinter. The Rawlins County wrap up will be in next week's paper.

**Wallace County 64,
St. Francis 39**

Eight St. Francis basketball players scored in the varsity contest with Wallace County on Tuesday, Feb. 15, but no one hit the double-figure mark. The Wildcats took home the 64-39 victory.

The Wildcats came out after a 21-15 halftime advantage and poured 43 points in the basket to widen the score as the game progressed.

"The first half we stayed in the game and were only down by six," Coach Ward Cassidy said. "All year long we have played hard no matter what the score was. The second half that concept went out the window and the guys completely lost their focus.

"We are young and hopefully they will learn from their mistakes."

St. Francis was 50 percent from three-point range, 34.2 percent from two-point range and 53.8 percent from the line. The number of attempted shots from the field was low with only 42 total.

St. Francis did well when it came to rebounding with 40. Twenty-seven of them were defensive. Heath Owens blocked two shots and A.J. McAtee and Joel McAtee each blocked one shot for a part of the defensive efforts. Raile had seven rebounds.

Quinter 73, St. Francis

Quinter High School was the site of the basketball game between the Bulldogs and the St. Francis Indians on Friday night.

Quinter came out of the first quarter with a 28-9 advantage and rolled to a 73-41 victory.

Quinter was hot the first half of the game scoring 49 points but during the second half the two teams played pretty even.

"AJ McAtee continued playing tough defense and handled the

ball against their press very well," Coach Ward Cassidy said. "Adam Peter had one of his best overall games both scoring and rebounding. Mac Frewen scored seven points and did a good job of in bounding the ball against pressure."

Peter scored 13 points for Sainty with AJ McAtee hitting 12. Frewen was 100 percent from two-points range with 3-of-3 while J. McAtee also was 100-percent with 1-of-1. Peter had the best percentage from the line with 3-of-4 for 75 percent.

The rebounding was 33 for St. Francis and 21 for Quinter while Peter and Tanner Kinen each had one blocked shot.

"Our young guys have all improved and it should pay off in the future," Coach Cassidy said. "The guys all got back to working hard and encouraging one another."
