

At the Game

Seniors end basketball career

Seniors Kelsey Dunn, Amy Grace and Chelsey Weeden formed the nucleus of the Lady Indian basketball squad this season. The season ended on Tuesday, March 1, when they were defeated by Hoxie in the first game of Sub-State action. The Ladies were matched up with the number one seeded team in the Leoti/Wichita County Sub-State.

Other players seeing varsity action during the season were juniors: McKenzie Grace, Talisa Voorhies, Jade DeGood, Ally Reichert, Schuyler Coates, Sheryl Miller, Maddie Knodel, Erin Neitzel and sophomores: Alecia Zimbelman, Danielle Flemming, Lauren Ross, Megan Rice, Brittany Lucas.

The Ladies are working under second year coach Devin Dinkel, assisted by Susan Dinkel, who returned to the coaching field.

Colby, Goodland, Hoxie, Oakley, Oberlin, Quinter and Rawlins County, all Northwest Kansas League teams, were part of the competition this season. The Lady Indians also participated in the Sagebrush Tournament in Brewster in December (finished seventh) and the Oberlin Invitational tournament in January (finished eighth). The team played non-leagues games with Dundy County, Neb., Cheylin, Sharon Springs, Brewster and Cheyenne Wells, Colo.

"We play in a very tough league," Coach D. Dinkel said. "Five of our losses are to teams that will be involved in State play, and will compete very well at State."

The 2004-05 team finished the season with a 3-17 overall record and a 0-7 Northwest Kansas League record.

Wins this year came against Cheyenne Wells and Cheylin, twice. The Ladies placed seventh in the Sagebrush Classic in December and eighth in the Oberlin Invitational in January.

"As the year went along we got more confidence with the basketball in our hands and did a lot of things better than we did early in the season."

Senior A. Grace was the leading

scorer for the team with 164 points, with 68 two-point shots and 28 free throws. She also was the leading rebounder with 114. Seventy of them were defensive boards and 44 offensive.

The Ladies had a number of players report last fall and as a result were able to field not only a varsity team and a junior varsity team but also scheduled C-team games to give the Ladies more time on the floor. Each trip out on the court will help develop players for the future.

"Hopefully the girls will play some throughout the off-season so that we will not have to start new again next year," Coach Dinkel said.

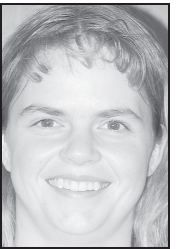

Lady Indians lose at Sub-State

Hoxie downed St. Francis in 2A Girls' Sub-State basketball action on Tuesday, March 1, in Hoxie. The final score was 80-38.

"We did some things pretty well against Hoxie," Coach Devin Dinkel said. "They are just an incredible team."

Hoxie moved on to the semi-final contest played in Leoti on Friday night and then on to the championship game, which they won.

A CHARTER ORDINANCE REPEALING CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. 02-01 EXEMPTING THE CITY OF BIRD CITY, KANSAS, FROM THE PROVISIONS OF K.S.A. 15-106.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BIRD CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1. Repeat. The City of Bird City, Kansas, by virtue of the power vested in it by Article 12, Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, hereby elects to and does repeal the enactment of Charter Ordinance No. 02-01 and upon the effective date of this charter ordinance, K.S.A. 15-106, and amendments thereto, shall apply and be in full force and effect.

Section 2. Publication. This Charter Ordinance shall be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in the official city newspaper.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Charter Ordinance shall take effect 61 days after final publication unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed, requiring a referendum to be held on the ordinance as provided an Article 12, Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, in which case this Charter Ordinance shall become effective upon approval by a majority of the electors voting thereon.
