

A CHARTER ORDINANCE RE-PEALING CHARTER ORDI-NANCE NO. 02-01 EXEMPTING THE CITY OF BIRD CITY, KAN-SAS, FROM THE PROVISIONS OF K.S.A. 15-106.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOV-ERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BIRD CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1. Repeal. The City of Bird City, Kansas, by virtue of the power vested in it by Article 12, Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, hereby elects to and does repeal the enactment of Charter Ordinance No. 02-01 and upon the effective date of this charter ordinance, K.S.A. 15-106, and amendments thereto, shall apply and be in Clerk full force and effect.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Charter Ordinance shall take effect 61 days after final publication unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed, requiring a referendum to be held on the ordinance as provided an Article 12, Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, in which case this Charter Ordinance shall become effective upon approval by a majority of the
