Fourth place finishers: Zach Gienger, Darris Keller, Trevor Reed, David Stephens, Darren Laffond.



Also participating were Garrett Brunk, Dustan Laffond and Garrett Figgins.



Ball player signs with Blue Jays

By Casey McCormick Area sports figure, major league baseball player Shea Hillenbrand, has left the Arizona desert to fly north. Hillenbrand will be the starting first baseman for the Toronto Blue Jays during the 2005 season.

Hillenbrand, who spent about a year and a half with the Arizona Diamond Backs, became the odd man out when the team signed third baseman Troy Glaus to a fouryear deal. In December Hillenbrand became a free agent and signed with the Blue Jays in the off season.

The move takes him back to the American League East where he began his career with the Boston Red Sox. While there he was named to an All-Star team.

Hillenbrand can play both corners of the infield and is know as an aggressive line drive hitter who is capable of doubles as

well a home runs. With the Diamond Backs last year he batted .310 with 15 home runs, 80 runs batted in and scored 68 runs.

He left a lasting legacy in Phoenix with a youth baseball field that was dedicated last July. Shea Hillenbrand Field was part of the Diamond Back Youth Field Program and is located in the suburb of Chandler.

The ball player is no stranger to St. Francis. His wife, Jessica (Rice), is the granddaughter of Albert and Bessie Burr. On two occasions Hillenbrand has given clinics here for young baseball enthusiasts.
