

The St. Francis boys track team opened the season in grand style Friday by placing first at the Hoxie Francis (J. McAtee, Ross, Hawkins, Invitational with 260 points. They accumulated over double the points of their nearest competition, Francis (Brown, Loyd, Hawkins, Rawlins County (127 points).

Among the first place finishers for the boys were the 4x100 meter Francis (Brown, Loyd, AJ McAtee, Francis (Lauren Ross, A. Grace, relay team (Joel McAtee, Derek Ross, JD Hawkins, Tanner Kinen) and the 4x400-meter relay team (Matt Brown, Dylan Loyd, Hawkins, Kinen).

Individual first place winners for the Indians were Kinen in the 110meter high hurdles and the 300meter hurdles; Mac Frewen in the 1600-meter run; J. McAtee in the Smull long jump and AJ McAtee in the high jump.

In the girls division, St. Francis 800-meter run: (2) AJ McAtee placed second with 87 points, only 2:14.06; (4) Gabe Smull, 2.26.56 seven points behind the winner, Oberlin with 94 points.

Individual winners for St. Francis were Megan Rice in the 300-meter hurdles; Danielle Flemming in the Laffond, 13:47.15; (6) Brady 3200-meter run; Talisa Voorhies in the long jump; Amy Grace in the high jump; and Ally Reichert in the shot put.
