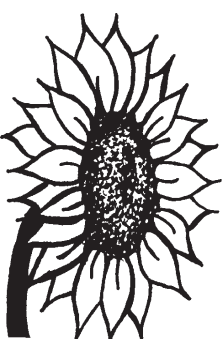


# At the Game



## Volleyball teams play well on Saturday, Sunday

The four St. Francis girls that play volleyball on the McCook Red Crush teams were in action on Saturday and Sunday in Islander Spring Spike Fest Grand Island, Neb. Ally Reichert plays on the 181 team, Talisa Voorhies on the 182 team, Lauren Ross on the 162 team and Lexee Reichert in the 12-and-under division. The Red Crush teams are all members of the McCook Junior Olympic Club.

In the 12-and-under division, L. Reichert's team ended their season with a good outing. They earned the championship of the Silver Tournament and were each awarded medals.

Ross's team also had a very good day at Grand Island. They moved into the championship bracket and defeated South Central to take the crown.

The Red Crush 182 team with Voorhies playing moved into the Bronze Tournament in their division where they won the tournament and received championship medals.

Some of the teams have one more event, on Sunday in Kearney.

### 18-and-under Team 181

A. Reichert's team had the following results on Sunday. In pool play, they won one (25-19) and lost one (20-25) to the Grand Islanders Gold; lost one (23-25) and won one (25-19) with South Central and lost one (21-25) and won one (25-22) playing against Nebraska West, giving them a 3-3 record.

In the Silver Tournament, they matched up with the Gold Stars winning the first game 25-17 but losing the last two 23-25 and 12-15.

### Team 182

This Red Crush team with Voorhies playing went into the Bronze Tournament playing against the Sparx. They were the winner in two games with the

scores of 25-16 and 25-15 placing them in the championship bracket against the SMW 17's. Red Crush 182 won the Bronze Tournament in two games, 25-22 and 25-16, and received championship medals.

In pool play earlier in the day they played in very close games emerging with a 2-4 record. First they went up against the Gold Star 17's winning the first game 25-21, and losing the second 24-26. Next against Midstate Select, they lost the first 18-25 and won the second 25-23. The last set of games were against the Quad County 18 Gold, and they lost both by close scores of 23-25 and 18-25.

### 16-and-under 162

In Ross's bracket there were two pools with four teams each. Red Crush finished pool play with a 3-3 record. They split with South Central 22-25 and 25-12, won two over Mid Star 25-19, 25-17 and lost two against SMW 21-25 and 15-25. They tied pool play record 3-3 with SMW so another game to 15 was played for the tie breaker and Red Crush won 15-11 to put them in the championship bracket.

It took three games for the Red Crush to emerge as champions but the final scores were 25-19, 20-25 and 15-7.

## Boys win opening track meet

The St. Francis boys track team opened the season in grand style Friday by placing first at the Hoxie Invitational with 260 points. They accumulated over double the points of their nearest competitor, Rawlins County (127 points).

Among the first place finishers for the boys were the 4x100 meter relay team (Joel McAtee, Derek Ross, JD Hawkins, Tanner Kinen) and the 4x400-meter relay team (Matt Brown, Dylan Loyd, Hawkins, Kinen).

Individual first place winners for the Indians were Kinen in the 110-meter high hurdles and the 300-meter hurdles; Mac Frewen in the 1600-meter run; J. McAtee in the long jump and AJ McAtee in the high jump.

In the girls division, St. Francis placed second with 87 points, only seven points behind the winner, Oberlin with 94 points.

Individual winners for St. Francis were Megan Rice in the 300-meter hurdles; Danielle Flemming in the 3200-meter run; Talisa Voorhies in the long jump; Amy Grace in the high jump; and Ally Reichert in the shot put.

Any new school records that were set will be published in the April 21 edition of the Herald.
