"The purpose of the forum is to listen to the concerns of the Technical Service Providers, landowners, and others so that we have the best technical services readily available," Mr. Klaege said.

"Since the final Technical Ser-

vice Provider rule was published in November 2004," he said. "Natural Resources Conservation Service needs to establish an ongoing dialogue with TSPs who participate and ensure that we respond to their concerns. This forum will allow us to get started."

Certified Technical Service Providers, others interested in being a Technical Service Provider, and landowners who have used or desire to use a Technical Service Provider and can provide comments on the process should attend this forum.

Oral or written comments will be accepted. People who would like to comment and cannot attend

the forum, may send written comments to John F. Ourada, State Conservation Engineer, or to Klaege by June 30. Comments should be sent to 760 South Broadway, Salina, Kansas 67401-4604.
