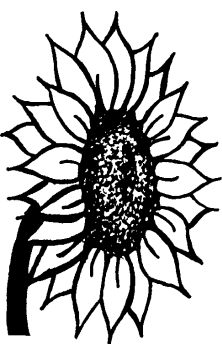


# At the Game



## C-teams ready for league tournament

The final make-up games have been played and the schedule is finished for the season. It is now time for the tournament to begin. The first game was scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. last night (Wednesday). Teams involved include Sox, A's, Reds, Cheylin 1, Cheylin 2 and Atwood.

**Monday, June 20  
Atwood 6, Sox 5**

"We had a few good plays and Isaac (Schiltz) had four strikeouts," Sox coach Clay Keller said concerning the Atwood win over the Sox. The final score was Atwood 6, Sox 5 in extra innings.

Most of the scoring was done early in the game with Atwood having two runs in the first inning, three in the second and the winning run in the final inning. St. Francis had four runs in the second inning and one in the fifth.

The four-run second inning for the Sox began when Brooks Hobrock reached base on a walk. Sam Reed, the third batter, hit a single, Josh Robinson had a base on balls, then I. Schiltz hit a double and Mason Schiltz a single. Hobrock, Reed, Robinson and I. Schiltz all crossed home plate before the inning was over. I. Schiltz also scored in the fifth run.

"We just couldn't get the out when we needed to," Coach Keller said.

Among those having hits were I. Schiltz, M. Schiltz, Reed.

**Cheylin 25, Reds 1**

The Reds scored one run in the first inning but were unable to add to that total during the remainder of the game. Cheylin 2 scored two runs in the first and three in the third for the 5-1 win.

"There was a tough effort from the kids," Red Coach Larry Finley said. "Cheylin pitched well."

"The Reds had a good defensive effort and pitched well but struggled hitting."

Trembly recorded 10 points to led the scoring in the 47-18 loss to Atwood 1.

The hitting percentage from the field was 26 percent (8/31) and from the free-throw line it was 40 percent (2/5).

The team had 23 rebounds with six offensive boards and 17 defensive ones. They also had two steals and four assists.
