Workshop planned

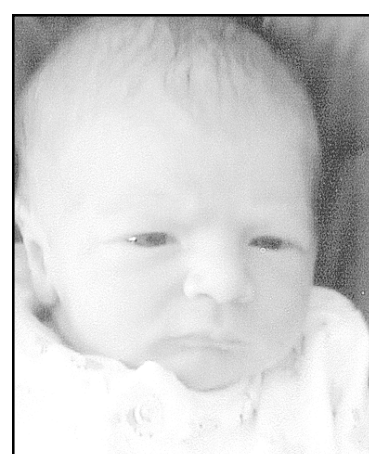
