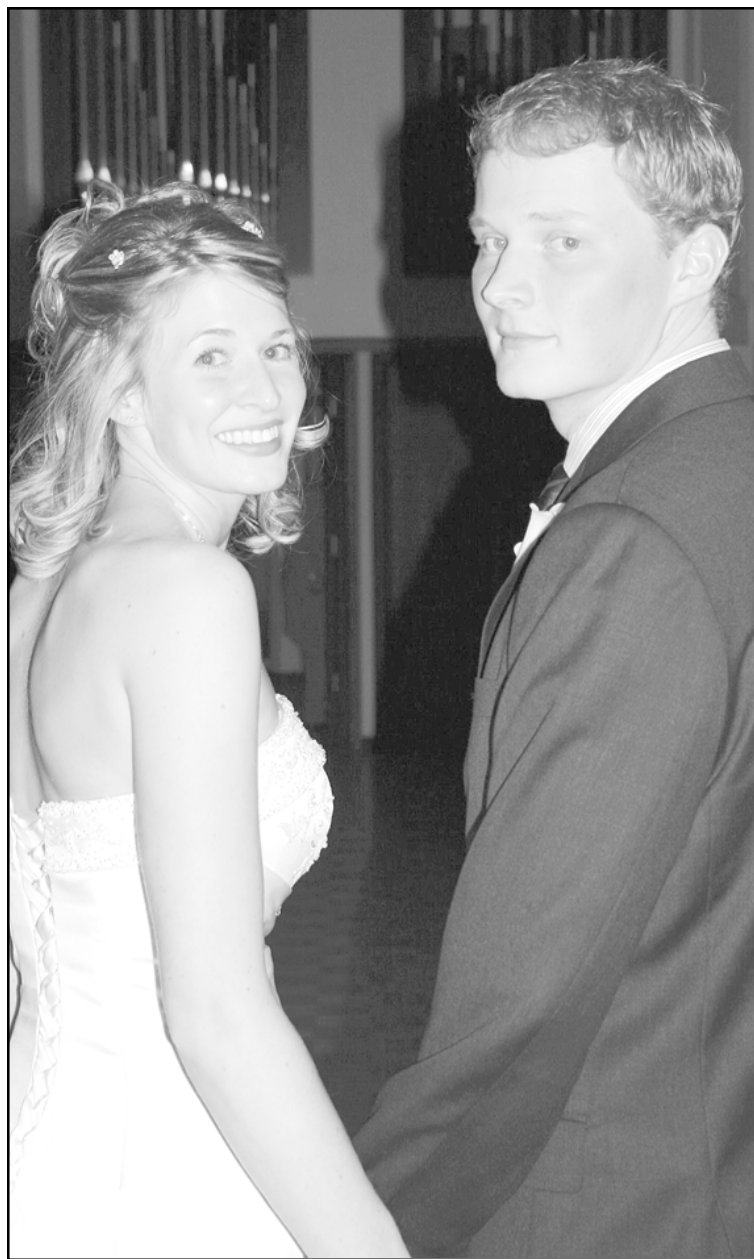


# At Home

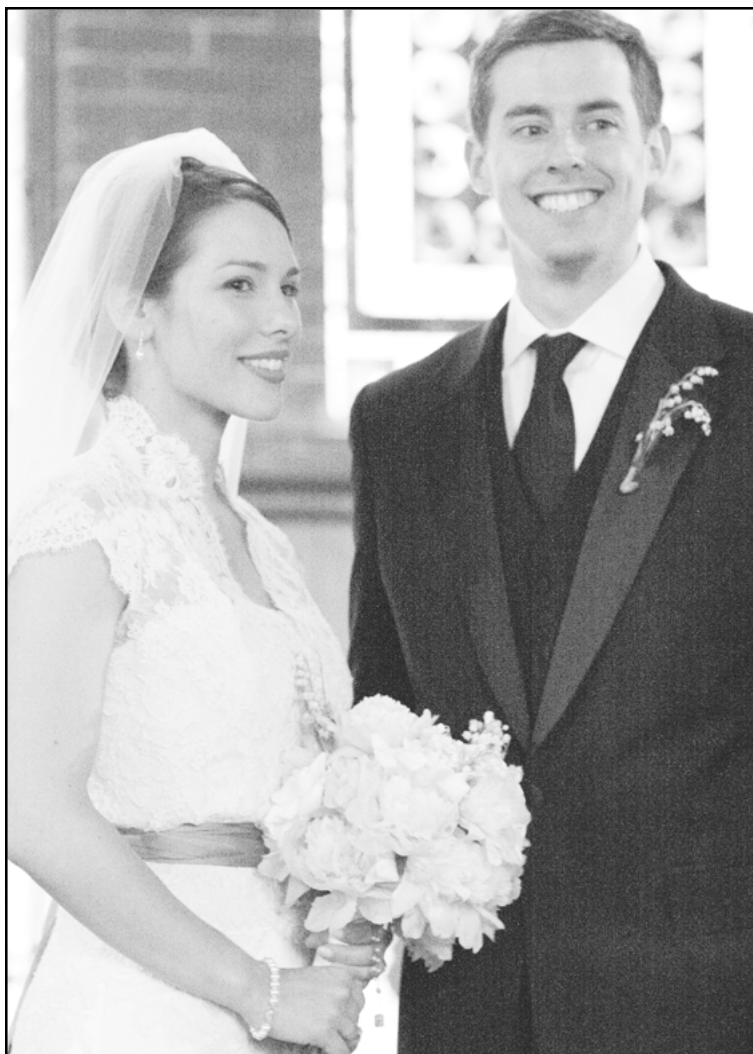

The list includes undergraduate students only. To be eligible, students must have enrolled in 12 or more credit hours and have a mini-

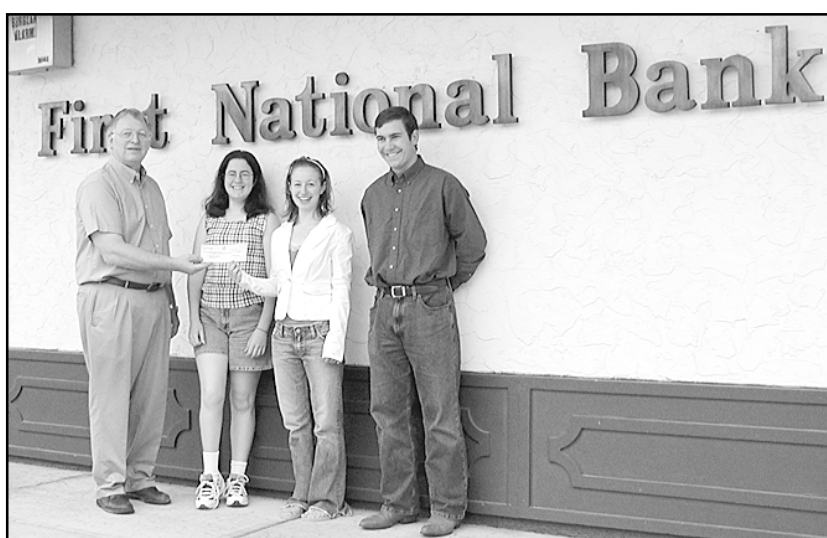
mum grade point average of 3.60 for the semester.

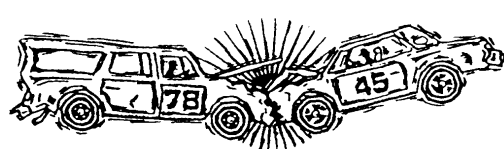

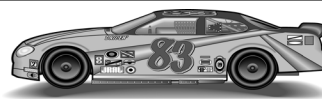
