Cancer patient meets her favorite country singer

Kellie Goodell, wife of Craig Goodell, Smolan, and daughter-in-law of Wayne Goodell, St. Francis, enjoyed a special evening when she met with her favorite country singer, Sara Evans, following a concert at the Stiefel Theatre in Salina.

In an article written by April Middleton, which appeared in the July 31 *Salina Journal*, Mrs. Goodell is featured. What made the meeting so special was Mrs. Goodell is battling cancer, and she and her best friend went to see Sara Evans perform and then she was going to have a brief meeting after the show.

Mrs. Goodell, 40, couldn't help but think it was going to be a good night. She didn't know the half of it, though, Ms. Middleton wrote.

After Ms. Evans finished her set at the Theatre, Mrs. Goodell and her friend stood near the box office waiting for their escort back stage.

After waiting in line with about 30 other people to get an autograph and photo with Ms. Evans,

Mrs. Goodell was on cloud nine.

"I can't believe I got to meet her," Mrs. Goodell said, after posing for her picture.

Everyone else had been ushered out the door after getting their minute or so with Ms. Evans and Ms. Evans had gone. Mrs. Goodell was still in the room talking about Ms. Evans and the concert when the singer came back into the room.

Mrs. Goodell looked up from her seat in her wheelchair with a smile on her face.

"I wanted to come talk with you for awhile because I heard tonight was kind of a special night for you," Ms. Evans said as she sat down beside Mrs. Goodell.

"Oh, you're going to make me cry," Mrs. Goodell said.

Ms. Evans asked her not to though because she can't contain her own tears if someone "even gets close to puckering up" in front of her.

It was a special night for Goodell. It was one of the few times in several years she had

gone out with a girlfriend and just had fun.

Since being diagnosed with breast cancer in 2000, Goodell isn't well enough to do a lot of the things she use to. The cancer has since spread to her brain, gall bladder and bones.

But, as soon as she heard Ms. Evans was performing in Salina, she knew she had to go.

"I've loved her since I heard her first song on the radio," Mrs. Goodell said.

Ms. Evans and Mrs. Goodell chatted like old friends for 20 minutes or more.

Mrs. Goodell told her about her battle with cancer. The rest of the time the women shared stories about their children and talked about Ms. Evan's tour schedule among other things.

As Ms. Evans departed, she hugged Mrs. Goodell and said, "I'll be praying for you."

That 20 minutes on top of the previous short meeting and the concert was a dream come true and bright spot for Mrs. Goodell.

Joyce Watts, Mrs. Goodell's mom, knew how much attending the concert would mean to her daughter.

So she visited with the family social worker at the Tammy Walker Cancer Center to see if Mrs. Goodell's chemotherapy could be delayed.

"As soon as I told her Kellie had tickets and how excited she was to go, she was on the phone with the Stiefel," Mrs. Watts, Bennington, said.

It took a few calls, but between the social worker and the Stiefel Theatre and Sara Evans' people, Mrs. Goodell was given a meet-and-greet pass that many fan club members also had.

"When they told me, I said, 'You're kidding,'" Mrs. Goodell said. "I've never gotten to go back stage or anything and I like Sara so much. I couldn't believe it."

Neither she nor her mother, though, knew she would have so much one-on-one time with the singer.

Mrs. Watts said she couldn't believe the people worked so hard to give her daughter a night she won't forget.

Mrs. Goodell doesn't get to do a lot of the things she loves.

"We try to do everything we can with her, but since she's been so sick, it's hard," Mrs. Watts said. "It's been quite an ordeal for Kellie. She deserved this. It makes me cry to think she got to do this."

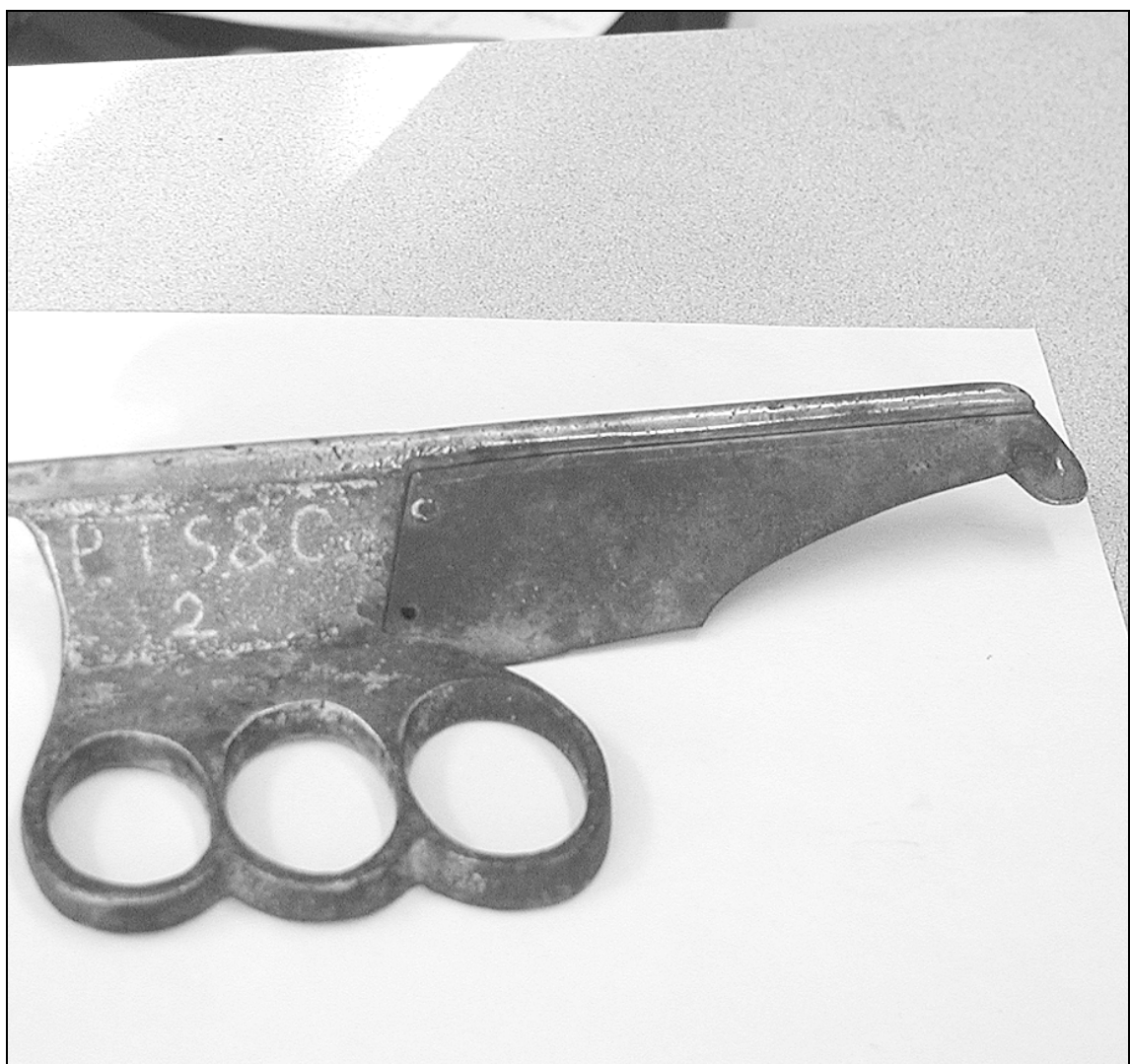

Proper identification of the unknown tool finally found

About a year and a half ago, Marion Miller brought a tool into *The Herald* office. A photo was run in the newspaper and, even though there were a number of guesses, no one was positive as to what it was.

As the reader can see in the photo, the fingers fit into the holes and it automatically laid in the hand. The extension of the tool looked like it was used to cut something but what did it cut? What was it used for?

The tool, which is brass, was found by one of Jack Weinstein's sons when they were cleaning out his shop at 303 E. Emerson Street. The son asked Jack what it was and he said he didn't know so they showed it to Mr. Miller. Mr. Miller was also puzzled but said he would try to find out. He asked numerous people and the newspaper photo

also brought in some responses.

One of the guesses was by Mil Dankenbring who said in the 1940s and 1950s, people driving tank wagons to deliver gas and kerosene to farms and homes could have used this handy tool to reset the numbers which measured the number of gallons delivered to each customer.

Finally, Mr. Miller sent the picture into the *Farm Collector* magazine. In the "Gizmos and contraptions" section of the August 2005 magazine, it told that the tool was owned by Mr. Miller. The article said Jim Mau found patent number 472,006 which looked very similar to Mr. Miller's mystery tool. According to the March 29, 1892, patent, "This invention relates to a knife for cutting broom corn, for pruning purposes or for any use re-

quiring a thin blade and a stout handle which can be firmly grasped in the hand." The patent called the tool a "knife."

Both Mr. Miller and Tobe Zwegardt had wondered if the tool might be a broom knife but they were unsure about it. The tool's blade which Mr. Miller has is broken at the end. The original plan showed a knife shaped much like a meat cleaver.

Now that the mystery is solved, he thinks he will give the knife to Norm Dorsch, Bird City, who has a collection of antique tools. In fact, Mr. Dorsch helped Mr. Miller find the magazine which was able to identify it.

He said he was glad that he had finally found out just what the tool was used for.

Commissioners to hold public meeting for grant funding

PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

The Cheyenne County Commission will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, August 16, 2005, at 10:30 a.m. in the County Commissioner's Room, Cheyenne County Courthouse, 212 Washington, St. Francis, Kansas, for the purpose of considering an application to be submitted to the Kansas Department of Commerce for Small Cities Community Development Block Grant funds under the Community Facilities category. A specific project application to be discussed is the replacement of a substandard bridge crossing Cherry Creek located 1/2 mile west and 1/2 mile north of St. Francis, Kansas, to serve an area generally directly north of the City of St. Francis. A

specific target area map can be seen at the Cheyenne County Clerk's office. Work will consist of the removal of the existing bridge and the construction of a new 100' long, 3-span, reinforced concrete haunched slab bridge, and the necessary clearing and grubbing, excavating, compacting and seeding. The estimated total project cost is \$337,243 with the grant request for \$69,750 of the project cost. Other project proposals introduced at the hearing will be considered. Oral and written comments will be recorded and become a part of the County's CDBG Citizen Participation Plan. Reasonable accommodations will be made available to persons with disabilities.

Requests should be submitted to the County Clerk's Office by August 15, 2005.
