Congressman talks to county residents

Congressman Jerry Moran visited Bird City's City Hall on Monday to discuss issues ranging from agriculture to the constitutional amendment. Twenty-six Cheyenne County residents were present during the town-hall meeting. Some asked questions while others sat quietly and listened to the ideas and concerns of the Congressman.

'What can we do to ensure that St. Francis and Bird City are here for another generation," he asked. "We haven't figured out how to have our sons and daughters return and make a living. That's how you change the future of business."

One area of importance is the beef industry. Congressman Moran agreed with Troy Burr of Bird City, that Japan needs to reopen its border to beef products.

Although the United States has reached an agreement to open trade with Japan, it hasn't happened yet. According to Congressman Moran, Japan sells twice the amount of goods to the United States than they

Congressman Moran backs a bill that will impose retaliatory trade issues such as health care, drought

sanctions against Japan if they don't live up to their agreement with the United States. An upcoming meeting in Washington with Japan's prime minister will determine what steps the government will take.

Congressman Moran said that the number one topic of conversation during his tour has been fuel prices. He discussed the energy bill, saying that it has been voted on six times in nine years.


Although supply and demand still has a role to play, he would like to see the United States become less dependent on foreign oil. He pointed out that 62 percent of America's energy is imported from abroad.

When asked about the constitutional amendment regarding the definition of marriage, Congressman Moran said the senate votes haven't been there. 

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
