Mrs. Morrow was immediately interested. Others also encouraged her, saying that it would be nice to keep this type of business in town. Mrs. Morrow and her husband David have a 16-month-old daughter Mia. The photography business along with a short season of coaching C-team volleyball at the high school and voice lessons would still allow Mrs. Morrow the time she wanted and needed at home with Mia. She invested in a Nikon digital camera, the lighting equipment and software for the computer. She made the backdrops in a variety of colors including black and white. She says she is self taught and has purchased and read several good books by big-name photographers which have given her some very good tips. Taking photos is one thing but Mrs. Morrow believes that it is im-

portant to know the people. "Pictures are more than a piece of paper with a face," she said. Knowing the person's interests and where they are the most comfortable is important. She encourages the people to think about where they would like the photos taken and just what kind of photo they want. She can take studio photographs (she has set up a studio at the Church of Christ) or she is willing to go outside. "Actually, no one can make a back drop (outside) like God can," she said. Mrs. Morrow is available to take senior, family and children photos along with wedding photos. She has taken photos of special events such as a baby shower which are compiled into an album. She enjoys taking photos of landscapes and has several for sale. She sees the new business as an opportunity to keep in contact with those she has worked with on the volleyball team and with voice lessons. She is also looking forward to meeting and working with other people. "I'm excited. It (photography) is a creative outlet," she said. Grant writing workshops offered

The Western Prairie Resource Conservation and Development (RC&D) is sponsoring another series of Grant Writing Workshops. Grant Writing I will provide the participant with information about foundations; who they give to and why; the process of a successful; fundraising campaign; how to structure a proposal, and what makes a successful grant seeker. Grant Writing II will take the grant writer through the research process for foundations and government funding. The tools used in research will be reviewed.
