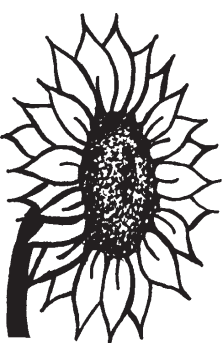


At the Game

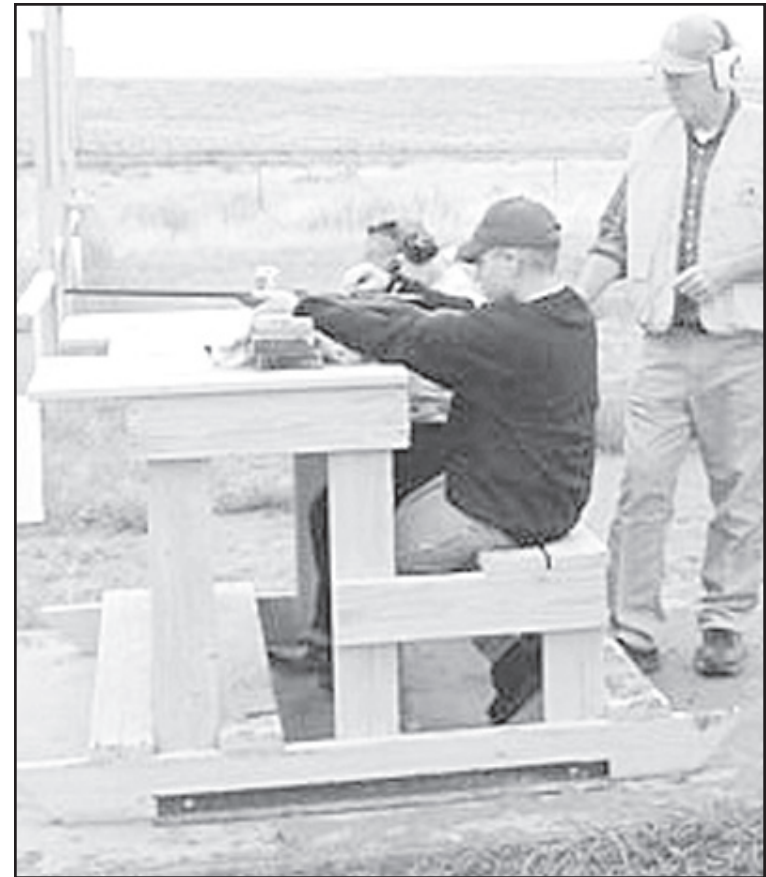
