# School District 103 requests annual county tax levy

Published in the Bird City Times, Bird City, Kansas, Thursdays, October 20 and October 27, 2005 (42-43).

 WHEREAS, pursuant to K.S.A. 2-623 (i) prior to approving the agreement of the proposed extension district, the Board of County Commissioners of Cheyenne County, Kansas, is required to provide certain notice.  
**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Cheyenne County, Kansas, that it is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners of Cheyenne County, Kansas, to approve an agreement to permit the Cheyenne County Extension Council to join Sunflower Extension District #6 in forming an extension district pursuant to K.S.A. 2-623, et seq.; and  
**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the extension district shall have for its sole purpose the giving of instruction and practical demonstration in agriculture, marketing, home economics, 4-H Club and youth work, community and resource development, and economic development initiatives to all persons in the extension district and the imparting of such persons of information on the subjects through practical demonstrations, meetings, publications, or otherwise in accordance with the program and service prescribed by the governing body of the extension district; and,
